**JumpStart, a partnership of the Howard County Public School System and Howard Community College, seeks to:**

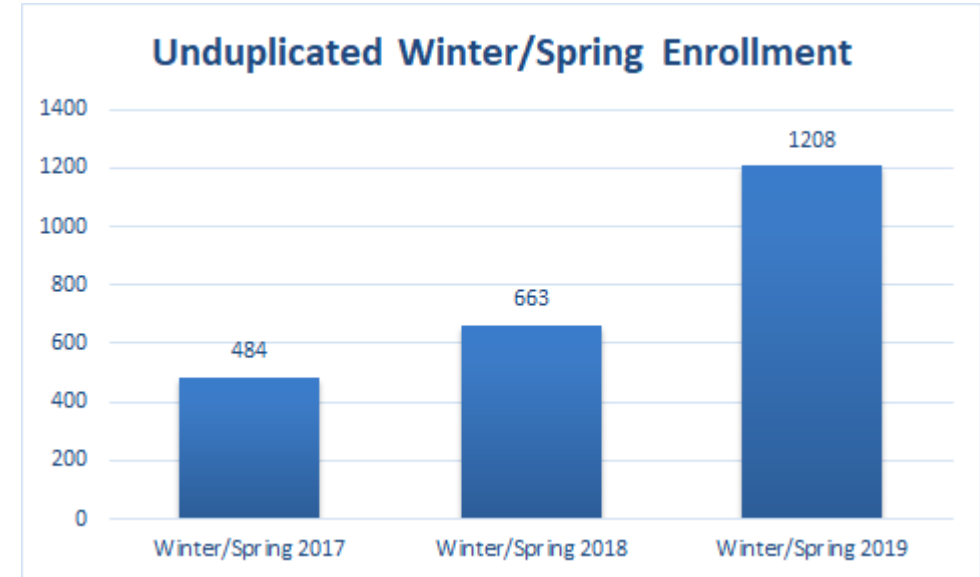
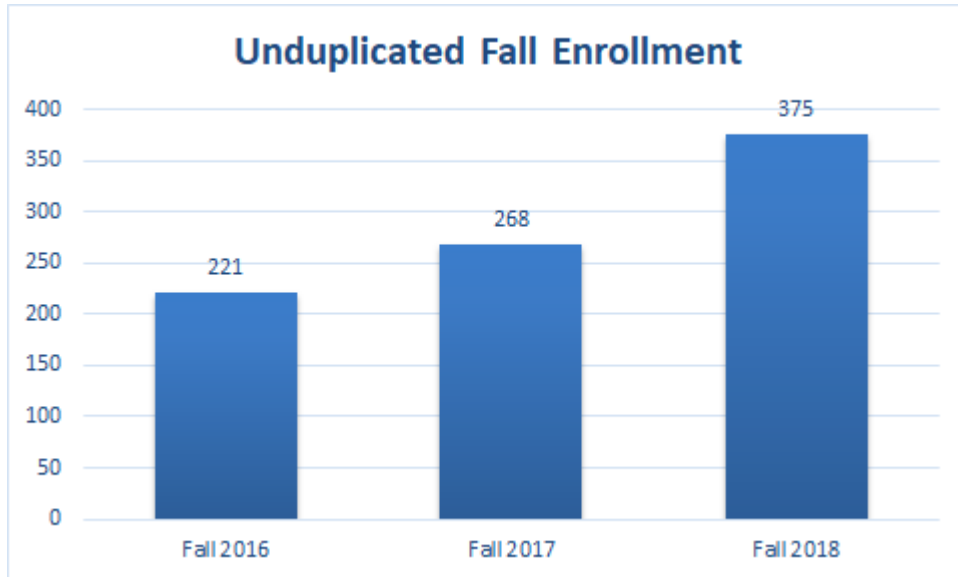
- Provide expanded options for students to gain college credits, explore careers, or earn an associates degree within a nurturing and inclusive environment.
- Emphasize JumpStart to underrepresented students as a vehicle to close the opportunity gap.

## Increasing Student Reach 2018-2019

- Annual HCPSS enrollment\*
  - 887 individual students took 1,086 HCPSS-based courses for HCC credit
  - 386 courses taken on HCC's campus were brought back for HCPSS credit by 261 individual students
- Enrollment in Winter/Spring increased by 82.2% from 2018 to 2019

Preliminary results indicate that we are drawing significant numbers of under-represented students to the program.

We have not yet finalized our reporting of student demographic information. Currently, we collect and report demographic information differently.

## Increased Access in 2018-2019

- Students who qualify for Free and Reduced Meals
  - 150 students took at least one HCPSS-based courses
    - 39 students (26%) took two or more courses
  - 27 students took 41 total HCC-based courses
  - 98 students are enrolled in a structured program
  - 11 of 12 high schools had students who qualify for free and reduced meals participate in Dual Enrollment

## Dedicating Our Resources

\$118,198.15 was spent to support students who qualify for FARMS

## Remarkable Accomplishments

- Three students graduated from HS with their HCC Diploma (Spring 2019)
  - Two Early College Program in Cybersecurity and one Early College Program in STEM
- Average HCC GPA: 2.45
  - Average Dual Enrollment Student GPA: 2.98
  - Average Dual Enrollment Student who qualifies for FARMs GPA: 2.72

- Total Tuition Discount Contribution by HCC- \$598,127.14
  - \$350,264 for HCC-based
  - \$247,862.14 for HCPSS-based
- Total Contribution by HCPSS- \$144,388
- Total Contribution by Bright Minds \$13,436



## Supporting Our Students

- Admissions advisors present in HCPSS buildings for one day per week at Oakland Mills and River Hill high schools
  - Conducted information sessions
  - Provided application and registration materials to all high schools
- Courses required for JumpStart Students' high school graduation were included in Early Alert. This will continue through the system redesign
- Completion specialist Sandy Cos working with Hispanic Achievement Liaisons. Process improvement would include JumpStart students in Ambiciones as soon as they enroll with HCC.

- Close collaboration with faculty with leadership of Dr. Laura Cripps
- Comprehensive professional development for HCPSS-based CC teachers
  - Summer curriculum writing
  - 2019-2020 1:1 meetings (grant)
- Collaborative development of OER resources (grant)



- Finalize comprehensive assessment plan
- Post-HS HCC enrollment
- Utilize data to inform next steps





- Fall 2019 Enrollment
  - 170 students registered as of 6/4/2019
  - 41 Students registered to participate in block schedule of courses
- 2,100 individual students have requested 2,600 total seats in CC courses



- Growth for FY21
- Next steps to scale to all schools?
