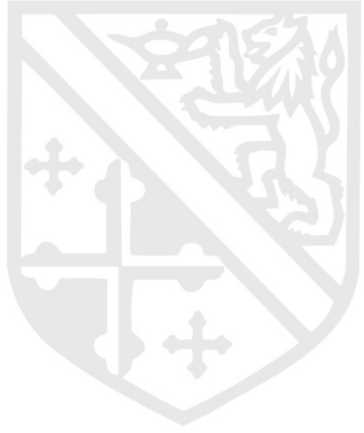

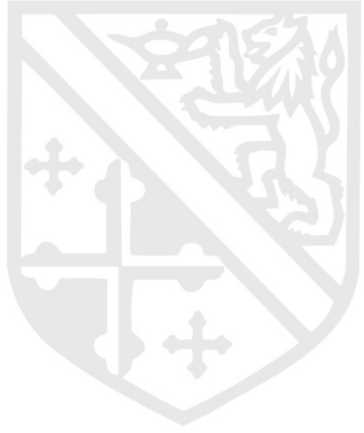

Early College: STEM

- Program launched: 2015
 - Students will complete 30 credits toward an HCC A.A. degree by high school graduation
 - One additional year at HCC to complete the A.A.
 - A.A. General Studies – Science Emphasis
 - A.A. Teacher Education Science and Math
- Students
 - At Oakland Mills High School
 - Some preference for first generation
 - 9th grade students identified for the program;
10th grade enrollment
 - Goal: 45-60 students per grade

Early College: STEM 2017-2018

Enrollment



- 12th Grade: 17 (on campus @ HCC)
 - Fall: ENGL 121, Chem 101, Additional Core Courses
 - Spring: Science Core, 2 additional Gen Ed Core classes
- 11th Grade: 31
 - Fall: Math 143
 - Spring: Engl 121, MATH 153
- 10th Grade: 51
 - Fall: Some in MATH 143 (Accuplacer, SAT, PARCC)
 - Spring: FYEX 100, some enrolled in MATH 153
- 9th Grade: 43
 - No college courses



Early College: Cybersecurity



- Program launched: 2014
 - Students graduate high school with 30 credits toward an A.A. in cybersecurity & prepare for employment with industry certificates
 - 1 additional year at HCC necessary to complete the A.A.
- Students:
 - Target population: students from 12 county public high schools
 - Some preference for first-generation students
 - Future students will be identified in 9th grade and start college course work in 10th grade (FYEX)
 - Goal: 25 students per year
 - 12th graders take classes at HCC

Early College: Cybersecurity

- Just graduated HS Seniors: 18
 - Courses vary
- 12th Grade: 17 (on campus at HCC)
 - Fall: Engl 121, Math 143, CMSY 163, CSCO 292
 - Spring: Gen Ed Core, Math 138, CMSY 164, CMSY 263
- 11th Grade: 28
 - Fall: CMSY 158, CMSY 162
 - Spring: CMSY 172, CSCO 291
- 10th Grade: 20
