

FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

The incident in Parkland, Florida impacted all of us last week. The

safety of your children is our number one concern. When these events happen and unfortunately this is way too often, I direct the school team to reassess security protocol at the school. The following adjustments will be made to security protocol at the building.

A. ENTRANCE TO BUILDING: (Effective no later than Thursday 2/22/18)

During the school day, it is our expectation that when someone buzzes to enter the office that the door is not immediately buzzed open.

- 1. Individual buzzes to get into the school
- 2. Staff member then asks through the intercom...

"Hello, may I help you?"

They will look up and see who is at the door. If they have any questions about the response or they just do not know an individual, an administrator will be called.

We ask all individuals to enter one or one family at a time. Please... if another individual is waiting at the door or if there is someone behind you, they will be asked to buzz in as well.

- 3. Parents must sign in at the Lobbyguard Kiosk. Please make sure that when you are in the building, go to where your business is and then return to the office. It is very appropriate for staff to ask, "do you need help getting where you are going".
 - 4.Please remember to check back into the office to sign out and leave your sticker.
- B. Identification- ALL adult individuals entering the building are expected to have some form of identification with them. This is so crucial. You would not believe the number of individuals who have driven here from home or work and do not have their driver's license with them. This is also important if you bring a grandparent of your child or someone else with you, they must also have identification. Only an administrator may approve their presence in the school without identification. School administration reserves the right to deny entry to the building to anyone who does not follow proper protocol.

C. FIRE DRILLS:

There will be adjustments to the way Fire Drills are conducted. Staff have been informed of changes.

D. OTHER DRILLS:

There will be adjustments to the way other drills are conducted. Staff have been informed of changes.

- E. Staff will participate in additional training regarding certain types of drills.
- F. PERIODIC CLASSROOM CHATS ABOUT SAFETY: These will occur twice during the year to assess student readiness for emergencies. The Student Support Team will lead these discussions in each team.

Of course, we try to prepare for every emergency. These efforts can only be supplemented by what you know about this school and the community we serve. Good "common sense" alertness always will help. We have so many staff that are alert to people, places, and things that just seem out of place. I appreciate the efforts of all the staff and community to address the needs of our students, staff, and school community. Please forgive me for not sending every detail of our response plan, quite frankly, I don't want every single person to have access to that kind of information. Those who need to know, have the information they need but please know that there are plans and training in place for staff and students.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Inclement weather days- After carefully reviewing options, the Superintendent wanted to provide you with the following information as well as his rationale about specific days to be used to make up school closings. We understand that any mid-year changes to the calendar can be disappointing, especially to students and families who have already made plans. Please be aware that our primary consideration in making these decisions is a commitment to quality instruction. We also wanted to provide you a level of predictability as we look ahead to the rest of the school year.

- Schools now will be in session on April 4, 5, and 6 and for a half-day on May 18 to make up for the four inclement weather days used.
- If schools are closed for one additional inclement weather day, June 15 will be used.
- State law mandates that the school year must be completed by June 15. If additional inclement weather closings become necessary, HCPSS will petition the Maryland State Department of Education for a waiver of the additional days.

The fifth possible make-up day on June 15 falls on a Muslim holiday. Per Board policy, no activities or exams can be scheduled on this day. This will require all end of school assemblies, promotion ceremonies, celebrations and final exams to be held on June 14 but still require students to attend on the day after. As an educator and a parent, our Superintendent knows that adding an additional day to the end of the school year would not effectively replace the valuable instruction days lost to inclement weather. HCPSS will use June 15 as a last resort to ensure that make up days will truly serve as replacement days for the instruction time that has been lost.

HCPSS INCLEMENT WEATHER MAKE-UP DAYS

Message from Dr. Michael J. Martirano, Superintendent

Dear HCPSS Community:

Now that we have had a fourth inclement weather related closing, I want to give you an update on the school calendar for the remainder of this year.

Our academic calendar designates five possible inclement weather make-up days: February 19, April 4, 5, and 6, and June 15. Using February 19 (President's Day) would have required a state waiver, as it is a state mandated holiday, and would have caused significant budget pressures. Instead, the Board of Education has approved the use May 18 in lieu of February 19 as a make-up day.

After carefully reviewing our options, I want to provide you with the following information as well as my rationale about specific days to be used to make up school closings. I understand that any mid-year changes to the calendar can be disappointing, especially to students and families who have already made plans. Please be aware that our primary consideration in making these decisions is a commitment to quality instruction. We also wanted to provide you a level of predictability as we look ahead to the rest of the school year.

- Schools now will be in session on April 4, 5, and 6 and for a half-day on May 18 to make up for the four inclement weather days used.
- If schools are closed for one additional inclement weather day, June 15 will be used.
 - State law mandates that the school year must be completed by June 15.

If additional inclement weather closings become necessary, HCPSS will petition the Maryland State Department of Education for a waiver of the additional days. The fifth possible make-up day on June 15 falls on a Muslim holiday. Per Board policy, no activities or exams can be scheduled on this day. This will require all end of school assemblies, promotion ceremonies, celebrations and final exams to be held on June 14 but still require students to attend on the day after. As an educator and a parent, I know

that adding an additional day to the end of the school year would not effectively replace the valuable instruction days lost to inclement weather. HCPSS will use June 15 as a last resort to ensure that make up days will truly serve as replacement days for the instruction time that has been lost.

We will continue to carefully weigh all decisions to close school when inclement weather threatens the safety of students and staff, and will notify families as soon as possible should any additional changes to the school calendar become necessary. When matters like this come to my attention, I will always act swiftly and decisively as I have during my tenure as superintendent and "stay in my lane" of protecting children.

I encourage you as parents, staff, students and community leaders to help reinforce this commitment to safety and security that we strive to provide in our schools.

Dear HCPSS community,

I am greatly disturbed every day by the public reports of sexual harassment and assault around our country. It is a frightening reminder of the world we live in where this type of behavior has gone unchecked for so many years. This is a predatory form of bullying with tremendous dangers and will not be ignored in the Howard County Public School System.

Anyone can be a victim of sexual harassment or assault. As a father, a man of high moral character and an educator for over 30 years, I view this world through the lens of my children and the 56,000 students I am entrusted to protect here in Howard County. As the interim superintendent of an organization with nearly 9,000 full-time employees, it is also my responsibility to protect our staff.

It is incumbent upon us, as educators, to properly train and empower our students and staff to stop sexual harassment and assault. Preventing inappropriate behaviors requires everyone to have the knowledge and skills to be upstanders who intervene and support a positive school climate for all.

I want to encourage every person in HCPSS to speak out against sexual harassment and assault and to report it. I will stand by your side to put an end to the harassment you are experiencing.

Howard County has gone a long way by advancing very specific language in HCPSS Policy 1020: Sexual Discrimination, which details the behavioral expectations of students and staff as well as processes for reporting unwanted inappropriate acts of harassment or assault. This spring, a committee will be convened to review the policy and find opportunities to strengthen preventative and response measures for the school system. I endorse stronger language in the policy and support the critical role of the Title IX Coordinator in responding to complaints.

So to our students, I ask you to seek out a trusted adult to report harassment or assault. To our parents, I encourage you to have these hard discussions with your children about what constitutes harassment and to empower them to speak up. To our staff, please, talk to a trusted colleague or contact Human Resources. If you are uncomfortable reaching out to a colleague, please do not hesitate to contact me directly. It is unacceptable behavior and we will protect every single person – staff or student – who

has been harmed.

We strive every day to create a safe learning and working environment in Howard County. I am proud of the work we do to help and empower each other and our children.

Grow Strong

At TVMS, we are committed to celebrating the strengths of our students. Throughout the school year, students are learning about their individual strengths. The Strengths Explorer describes 10 strength themes: Achieving, Caring, Competing, Confidence, Dependability, Discoverer, Future Thinker, Organizer, Presence, and Relating. Although students have each of these strengths within themselves, certain themes have been identified as their **top three** strengths.

The most important thing is to stay positive. This simple quote is a reminder of why being a strength-based school makes TVMS a special place to work and to learn. By focusing on strengths, we create an environment where the focus is on being our best selves and seeing the best in others. Too often, the societal norm is to try to "fix" what is wrong with people. Instead, it would be wise to focus on what is right with a person.

One terrific result of having students complete the Strengths Explorer is that it gives them something positive to turn to at any moment. We asked students the following three questions:

- What are your three strengths?
- What is your favorite strength?
- How do you show this strength?

We heard immediate and refreshing responses. One student shared that her three strengths are Organizer, Dependability, and Relating. Of these three, she likes Relating the best. She shows this strength by being nice to others.

A second student shared that her three strengths are Organizer, Achieving, and Competing. She likes Organizer the best because she says this helps her a lot inside and outside of school.

Identifying our strengths, and returning to them repeatedly, helps keep a positive mindset.

Policy Corner - Sexual Harassment (Policy 1020)

The Board of Education of Howard County is committed to providing an educational and work environment that is free from sexual discrimination. To that end, the Board of Education prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in its educational program, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, and in the workplace, as required by law.

Employees and third parties share responsibility for the health, safety and general welfare of students; for contributing to a school environment free from sexual discrimination; and for maintaining appropriate relationships with students. Employees, students and third parties may be subject to disciplinary action or consequences for inappropriate behavior of a sexual nature, even when the behavior does not rise to the level of sexual discrimination as defined by prevailing federal and state laws.

It is a violation of this policy for any student, employee or third party to engage in sexual discrimination or to engage in retaliation with regard to complaints of sexual discrimination.

Sexual discrimination includes sexual harassment, sexual assault and sexual violence and is characterized as unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature that interferes with a student's ability to learn, study, work, achieve, or participate in school activities or with an employee's/ third party's term, condition or privilege of employment/relationship with the school system. Sexual discrimination can be committed by a student, employee, or third party.

Sexual harassment is unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature. Examples of sexual harassment include, but are not limited to: offensive language verbally or in writing, including electronic formats; visual harassment such as derogatory posters, photography, cartoons, drawings, clothing or gestures; unwelcome sexual advances; spreading rumors about or evaluating someone for their sexual behavior; taunting or ridiculing someone because of perceived or actual sexual orientation; or pressuring someone for sexual activity.

Sexual assault is unwanted sexual contact or threat. Examples of sexual assault include, but are not limited to: unwanted touching of a person's body in a sexual way without the person's consent such as patting, pinching, or impeding or blocking a person's physical movement, or engaging in unwelcome sexual contact.

Sexual violence is any type of contact that occurs without the explicit consent of the recipient such as fondling, forced sexual intercourse, sexual battery, rape, molestation or incest.

A student who chooses to file a sexual discrimination complaint must do so orally or in writing with a teacher, school counselor, school-based administrator, or the Title IX Coordinator for action in accordance with established procedures. Written complaints are to be completed using the Bullying, Harassment, or Intimidation (BHI) Reporting Form. All such reports must be filed with or forwarded to the Title IX Coordinator who will oversee and support the investigation.

In each phase of complaint resolution, every reasonable effort shall be made to maintain the confidentiality and protect the privacy of all parties. These efforts may be limited by the school system's legal and regulatory obligation to investigate and address allegations of sexual discrimination.

Upon completion of an investigation of a complaint received, the investigator will send a prompt, written report of the findings and actions to be taken, if any, to the appropriate parties. Such reporting will follow established confidentiality guidelines.

Violations of this policy are cumulative; subsequent offenses may affect the nature and severity of the consequences. Use and/or exhaustion of these procedures is not a prerequisite for the filing of complaints with the federal Office for Civil Rights.

Policy Corner - Student Rights' and Responsibilities (*Policy 9020*)

The rights and responsibilities of individuals are preserved through the protection and preservation of the rights of others. Students have a responsibility for their own learning, for their personal conduct and for the manner in which they exercise their rights. Students must accept the consequences of their actions. Students have the responsibility to participate in the educational program offered by their schools and, in doing so, are bound by the policies of the Howard County Public School System.

Students have specific responsibilities and rights related to school attendance, student expression, disciplinary action, due process, search and seizure, student records, student activities, use of school facilities, and non-discriminatory practices.

Tips for School Success – Tips for School Success: Review that Report Card

Pay careful attention to all progress reports, but particularly the first one—it will be coming soon if your child hasn't received it yet. You want to get help for any problem

areas before your child falls too far behind. Ask your child's teacher how grades are determined and for suggestions on how your student can improve. Review grades and the teacher's comments with your child—always starting with something she's doing well, then pointing out areas that need attention, and ending with something positive again.

Policy Corner - Trespassing or Willful Disturbance (*Policy 3020*)

The school system has the legal authority to take action when anyone willfully disturbs or otherwise prevents the orderly conduct of school system instruction, administration or activities. Additionally, Maryland law provides criminal penalties for any individual who trespasses on school property or fails to leave school property after being asked to do so by authorized personnel.

Any willful disturbance or interference with the orderly conduct of activities, including bodily harm or threats of bodily harm to an individual who is lawfully on school property; threats to a student or employee by any means including in-person, by telephone, or by electronic means; or any willful damage or defacing of school property or building is a violation of policy and may be a violation of the law.

Any individual found to be on school property after receiving prior legal notice that his/her access to school system property has been denied, or who remains on the property after being asked to leave, is considered to be trespassing.

When an individual commits any of the offenses noted above, the building administrator may take several actions:

- Explain how the individual's behavior is unacceptable.
- Issue a warning letter to the individual.
- Issue a letter that summarizes the disruptive behavior and any prior discussions or warnings and which informs the individual that any further incidents will lead to a formal denial of access.
- Issue a denial-of access letter.

When a denial-of-access letter is issued to the parent of a student enrolled at the school, the letter will explain how the parent may continue to discuss legitimate school issues regarding his or her child.

Tips for School Success – Designate a Study Area

Help your child by providing a quiet, well-lit, low-traffic space for study time. Take it one step further and institute a "communications blackout" policy with no cell phones or instant messaging allowed until schoolwork is done.

Policy Corner - Student Assault and/or Battery on Staff (Policy 9270)

In order for learning to take place, the school environment must be safe and orderly. Therefore, any assault and/or battery by a student on a school staff member is strictly forbidden. An assault may be physical, oral, or written. Battery I is the unlawful touching of another person by the aggressor and battery II involves unlawful touching plus a display of blatant disregard for the safety of the staff member or others.

Consequences for an assault violation range from suspension to expulsion. A battery I violation results in suspension of not more than 45 days. A first battery II offense results in a suspension or expulsion. A second battery II offense results in expulsion. A student who violates this policy is ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities for the duration of a suspension or expulsion.

Policy Corner – Weapons (Policy 9250)

The presence of weapons on school property poses a serious threat to the safety and well being of students and staff. It is unlawful for any person to carry or possess any rifle, gun, knife, or deadly weapon of any kind on any public school property in the state of Maryland. A weapon, as defined by school system policy, includes: any gun, dirk knife, bowie knife, switchblade knife, star knife, buck knife, hunting knife, throwing star, razor, metal knuckle, Nunchaku, explosive device, or any other object or implement intended to cause harm to another or used in such a way as to cause harm to another. Any student found in possession of a weapon on school property will be suspended and the police notified. Possession of a gun, or any implement possessed under a circumstance that would reasonably lead a person to believe it was a gun, will result in expulsion.

Tips for School Success – Family Calendar



Dear HCPSS community,

I am greatly disturbed every day by the public reports of sexual harassment and assault around our country. It is a frightening reminder of the world we live in where this type of behavior has gone unchecked for so many years. This is a predatory form of bullying with tremendous dangers and will not be ignored in the Howard County Public School System.

Anyone can be a victim of sexual harassment or assault. As a father, a man of high moral character and an educator for over 30 years, I view this world through the lens of my children and the 56,000 students I am entrusted to protect here in Howard County. As the interim superintendent of an organization with nearly 9,000 full-time employees, it is also my responsibility to protect our staff.

It is incumbent upon us, as educators, to properly train and empower our students and staff to stop sexual harassment and assault. Preventing inappropriate behaviors requires everyone to have the knowledge and skills to be upstanders who intervene and support a positive school climate for all.

I want to encourage every person in HCPSS to speak out against sexual harassment and assault and to report it. I will stand by your side to put an end to the harassment you are experiencing.

Howard County has gone a long way by advancing very specific language in HCPSS Policy 1020: Sexual Discrimination, which details the behavioral expectations of students and staff as well as processes for reporting unwanted inappropriate acts of harassment or assault. This spring, a committee will be convened to review the policy and find opportunities to strengthen preventative and response measures for the school system. I endorse stronger language in the policy and support the critical role of the Title IX Coordinator in responding to complaints.

So to our students, I ask you to seek out a trusted adult to report harassment or assault. To our parents, I encourage you to have these hard discussions

with your children about what constitutes harassment and to empower them to speak up. To our staff, please, talk to a trusted colleague or contact Human Resources. If you are uncomfortable reaching out to a colleague, please do not hesitate to contact me directly. It is unacceptable behavior and we will protect every single person – staff or student – who has been harmed.

We strive every day to create a safe learning and working environment in Howard County. I am proud of the work we do to help and empower each other and our children.

The Howard County Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission invites Howard County middle and high school students to participate in the Commission's annual Student Essay Contest. The winners will be recognized at the Commission's Annual Celebration on Sunday, January 14, 2018, at Reservoir High School, 11550 Scaggsville Rd, Fulton, MD 20759.

To be eligible for the contest, students must be a Howard County resident and in either middle or high school. Essays must be typed and double-spaced, in the Microsoft Word format, and it needs to include the following information: student's name, address, telephone number, email address, name of school, and student grade. Middle school student essays are to be between 500 to 750 words in length, while high school student essays must be between 750 to 1,000 words. Essays will be judged on content, connection to Dr. King's work, spelling, grammar, and sentence structure.

Students with disabilities may submit entries that address the essay question through use of other media (posters, pictures, etc.). All submitted essays and entries become the property of the Commission.

For their entry, students are to reflect upon Dr. King's statement, which is the event theme this year: "If I cannot do great things, I will do small things in a great way." And the essay question is "How do you translate Dr. King's vision in today's times?" Based on this statement, students are asked to focus on both the present and the future, how Dr. King inspired them to work towards a greater cause.

Policy Corner - Civility (*Policy 1000*)

The Board has set clear expectations for civil behavior that supports a safe, engaging, and supportive environment on school property and at school-related activities. Unacceptable behaviors include but are not limited to:

- · Rude, insulting, or demeaning language and/or actions
- Persistently unreasonable demands
- Intrusive and/or interruptive behavior
- Displays of temper
- Harassment and intimidation
- Threatening and/or abusive gestures and behavior

Each individual is responsible for behaving in a civil manner and for cooperating in resolving incidents of uncivil behavior. When resolution is not reached through cooperative agreement, either party involved may cite this policy and notify the other person that they are ending the conversation or the interaction and removing themselves from the situation by ending a phone call, walking out of the room, or requesting the other individual to leave the room

For a complete description of policies, refer to the *Student & Parent Handbook* 2017-18.

Tips for School Success - Civility

Practicing good manners relates to a student's personal behavior. Saying "please' and "thank you," letting others go first, and sharing when necessary are all examples of proper actions at the personal level.

Civility comes to life when we think beyond the personal and push outward to others. A few examples:

- Expecting students to show respect for others in the classroom and beyond.
- Being willing to listen to others as they share their views.
- Being considerate and practicing restraint when criticizing the beliefs and choices of other people.

Many people think civility applies only to behavior, but the word itself points to a larger

meaning. Looking beyond your classroom, civility is important to teach as it speaks to the idea that we all belong to something larger than ourselves.

Instead of merely focusing on the idea of a child controlling their behavior to please their teachers, instead help the students see themselves as part of a greater good.

CogAT Testing Scheduled for December 5th, 6th, 7th

On December 5th, 6th and 7th, all third and fifth grade students will participate in the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT). The CogAT is a group-administered abilities test that measures students' reasoning abilities, which they develop through in-school and out-of-school experiences. It is not designed to test a student's academic achievement, but their potential.

The test is made up of three batteries - Verbal, Quantitative, and Nonverbal. Each battery takes approximately 30 minutes to complete. The CogAT helps educators understand a student's cognitive strengths and weaknesses and assists with adapting instruction to meet the needs and abilities of each student. No special preparation is required. Just send your child to school ready to learn as you do daily.

The Gift and Talented Education Program will use the data from the CogAT as one criterion for placement into fourth grade Gifted/Talented mathematics classes and middle school Gifted/Talented content classes. Students' individual scores will be reported to parents in late February/early March.



Follow-up on Sunday Evening's Message

Dear Oakland Mills Community,

I wanted to follow-up on the message I sent Sunday evening regarding a social media post that generated significant attention in our community.

While we continue to investigate the post in question, it is important that we maintain a supportive environment so every student at Oakland Mills is able to focus on their

responsibilities as a student without fear of intimidation, bullying, or threats. Although we recognize the sensitivity and harm the social media post has created, we are still working with the Howard County Police Department to investigate the post. In the meantime, I want to caution the community that jumping to conclusions or making assumptions based on incomplete information can too often lead to saying hurtful words that we cannot take back. I ask that you help support the Oakland Mills staff by talking with your child at home. Please help them understand that words can indeed hurt, to be very careful about what they post on social media, and to refrain from rushing to judgement.

As Dr. Martirano has said several times over the last few weeks: bullying and intimidation of any kind will not be tolerated in the Howard County Public School. Just like we are taking the social media post seriously and taking necessary action, the administration will take disciplinary action against students who chose to bully – whether in person or online – according to the HCPSS <u>Policy 1060</u>. At Oakland Mills, we want to provide a safe, nurturing environment for all students and staff. I appreciate your support.



Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission Student Essay Contest

The Howard County Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission invites Howard County middle and high school students to participate in the Commission's annual Student Essay Contest. The winners will be recognized at the Commission's Annual Celebration on Sunday, January 14, 2018, at Reservoir High School, 11550 Scaggsville Rd, Fulton, MD 20759.

To be eligible for the contest, students must be a Howard County resident and in either middle or high school. Essays must be typed and double-spaced, in the Microsoft Word format, and it needs to include the following information: student's name, address, telephone number, email address, name of school, and student grade. Middle school student essays are to be between 500 to 750 words in length, while high school student essays must be between 750 to 1,000 words. Essays will be judged on content, connection to Dr. King's work, spelling, grammar, and sentence structure.

Students with disabilities may submit entries that address the essay question through use of other media (posters, pictures, etc.). All submitted essays and entries become the property of the Commission.

For their entry, students are to reflect upon Dr. King's statement, which is the event theme this year: "If I cannot do great things, I will do small things in a great way." And the essay question is "How do you translate Dr. King's vision in today's times?" Based on this statement, students are asked to focus on both the present and the future, how Dr. King inspired them to work towards a greater cause.

All completed nomination forms must be emailed or postmarked by 5:00 p.m., Friday, November 17, 2017, to Dr. MLK Student Essay Contest, c/o Howard County Office of Human Rights, 6751 Columbia Gateway Drive, Suite 239, Columbia, MD 21046, or emailed to SubmissionsMLK@howardcountymd.gov.

Policy Corner - Responsible Use of Technology and Social Media (Policy 8080)

Students must act in a responsible, civil, ethical, and appropriate manner when using technology for HCPSS-sanctioned activities. Students may not reveal personally identifiable information (e.g., home phone numbers, addresses, or social security numbers) except in specific circumstances where such information is required to complete academic assignments. In such circumstances, prior written consent from the parent or legal guardian of the student is required. Schools will identify times and places for online activities. Schools will also ensure that signed HCPSS parent permission forms (Responsible Use of Technology Agreement/

Internet Use Permission Form) for each student are collected and kept on file. Students will access only those network resources for which they have obtained permission, using the account assigned to them.

Students will not create, access, download, store, or print content that:

- Depicts profanity, obscenity, the use of weapons, terrorism, or violence.
- Promotes use of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or other illegal or harmful products.
- Contains sexually suggestive messages.
- Is sexually explicit or obscene.
- Depicts gang affiliation.
- Contains language or symbols that demean an identifiable person or group or otherwise infringe on the rights of others.
- Causes or is likely to cause a disruption to school activities or the orderly operation of the school.
- Contains rude, disrespectful, or discourteous expressions inconsistent with civil discourse or behavior.
- Constitutes bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or intimidation in violation of Policy 1040 Safe School Environments, or Policy 1060 Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, or Intimidation.

For a complete description of the policy, refer to the *Student & Parent Handbook 2016-17*.

Tips for School Success - Take Care of Technology Equipment

Students must take care of the technology equipment, which can be viewed as a privilege. It is also important for students to learn to protect the technology resources (Cennamo, Ross, and Ertmer, 2010). Malware such as viruses, worms, and Trojan horses are even more prevalent today because of the increased use of email, fax, blogs, social media, etc. Students should be alert and active at all times when encountering suspicious messages, links, pop-up windows, etc. to prevent computers from being infected with malicious software (Cennamo et al., 2010). Students should immediately let their teacher know if there may be malware on a computer, so that any problems can be addressed right away. For more tips, please visit the website.

From the Principal's Desk...

The purpose of this conference window is to allow parents/guardians the opportunity for a quick meet and greet with staff to discuss general student progress. Accordingly, each conference slot is ten minutes long. If you have a pressing concern, you are strongly encouraged to contact the teacher to discuss it outside of the conference window. *Synergy Conference Management* allows users to schedule time with individual teachers. When creating your schedule, be certain to build in travel time from one conference to the next, as it is important to stay on schedule. We do not recommend scheduling your conferences back-to-back as you will lose meeting time while traveling from one classroom to the next.

To permit access to our staff by all parents with interest, we ask that parents schedule conferences only for those classes for which there are concerns. Unlike your experience in elementary school, middle level educators do not have a slot for each and every student. So, please be strategic about who you'd like to see and mindful of the need for your neighbors to have the same access.

For step by step directions, please refer to the <u>user guide posted to the county website</u>. We look forward to seeing you during conference week. Halloween is a regular school day at Mount View, and students should wear appropriate clothing for school. Costumes, masks and props are to be left at home. Thank you for understanding.







From the Principal's Desk...

I want to start by thanking the countless family members who have supported our school activities over the last few weeks. From beloing out at our PTA Fun Knight in both formal and

informal ways, to attending the first Restaurant Knight, to coordinating drop off or pick up of students for the 6th grade Outdoor Ed experience, to the ultimate sacrifice of actually going on that trip and helping to chaperone over 200 sixth graders who attended. To each of you we send you our heartfelt thanks and gratitude. The message you send to our students and staff when you take time out to help and participate in these school events is critical to our mission. Thank you for supporting us and for being an active partner in our community effort to educate and care for our students.

Next week, on Wednesday, October 25th, we will be participating in National Unity Day sponsored by The National Bullying Prevention Center. We will demonstrate our commitment to take a stand against bullying by wearing orange. "ORANGE provides a powerful, visually compelling expression of solidarity," said Paula Goldberg, Executive Director of PACER Center. "When hundreds of individuals in a school or organization wear orange, the vibrant statement becomes a conversation starter, sending the unified message to kids to know that they are not alone." Continuing our color theme to round out the month and finish strong, on October 31st, we will also participate in **PINKtober** in recognition of the fight against Breast Cancer. On this date, we're asking everyone to wear pink. I know what you're thinking, "But, that's Halloween!" I know that. So? Wear pink anyway. It'll be fun! We don't do costumes in middle school anyway.

On the subject of the holiday that has become a reason to stuff our faces with mini-sized candy treats, I won't be sending another regular Knight before then, so I'm going to need to address the candy situation now. You know what I'm talking about, the importance of rationing those 250 pieces of candy the average Trick-or-Treat pumpkin holds (-or- the equivalent of three pounds of sugar -or- 9,000 calories for those of you who count them). Here are some tips to take advantage of the fall time change:

- Wait to change your clocks until it is time to get ready for bed.
- Go to bed at your normal bedtime.
- Just before getting into bed, set your clocks back one hour.
- · Wake up at your normal time in the morning.
- Take note of how much better you feel after an extra hour of sleep.
- Continue to go to bed each night at the earlier bedtime.

In addition to using this opportunity to improve the quality and quantity of our sleep, you should also pick up batteries while you're purchasing those bags of Halloween treats. Use those batteries to replace those in your smoke detector. Consider this routine important not only as a safety, but also as a sleep safeguard. Everybody knows the batteries in the smoke detectors only die in the dead of the night!



If you child has a health condition, there are health condition history forms coming home and some medication orders. If you have not already, please bring your child's medications along with the medication order form completed by Doctor to school, if you would like to have medications available for your child at school. This is very important for children with asthma and serious life threatening food allergies.

Extra Set of Clothing:

Please pack an extra setting of clothing for your child to have here at school. Children sometimes have bathroom accidents, fall in the mud/puddles outside at recess, vomiting when sick and/or spill food at lunch time. It is always nice to have a clean set to change into when needed. This also saves parents trips to school to bring clean clothing.

This Week In Classroom Guidance with Mrs. Tasch:

K – We read portions from the story, "We Share Everything," by Robert Munsch. Students then brainstormed and role played (acted out) ways to share items by either: splitting an item in half; taking turns and identifying how to handle situations when one person is not finished using an item; trading and always remember to trade back when finished; and playing together.

5th – We reviewed the school-wide conflict resolution program Kelso's Choices. Students recalled the program breaks a problem into two types of problems: small and BIG. A BIG problem involves some sort of physical hurt, harm, or a stranger and requires the nearest trusted adult's help to solve. A small problem is any problem that does not involved physical hurt, harm, or strangers. In these situations, students can utilize 2 of 8 ways to deal with the problem from Kelso's Wheel of Solutions. If a small problem persists beyond a student's use of 2 different choices from the solutions wheel, children should go to a trusted adult for more help with the problem.

Additionally, the month of October is Bullying Prevention Month. Students in 5th grade also began a lesson using the story, "Trouble Talk" by Judy Ludwig to identify the types of bullying and how to handle social/verbal/emotional bullying. This lesson will continue during the November/December guidance lesson. NOTE: students also discussed that physical bullying requires an adult's attention

right away!



From the Principal's Desk...

I have tried to start this newsletter four times. I wanted to open by saying something profound about how the news of the senseless act of violence that occurred earlier this week in Las Vegas has left us reeling from shock. But, I am having trouble finding those words. I think that must be because there are so many to say and yet none of them seem to capture the complex series of thoughts, ideas, and concerns that linger. What is there to say about the loss of 59 people or the injury of over 500? How do we sort through our feelings about the hot topics of gun control, mental health, and constitutional rights? If we have trouble putting our own feelings into words, imagine how our children must be struggling to make sense of the situation. I suspect you've already engaged in some degree of discussion with your children. If you haven't made an attempt because you weren't sure about the words to choose, we are linking a resource for you to refer to from the National Association of School Psychologists (Tips for Parents and Teachers). Raising awareness of safety and security is never a bad idea. I encourage you to find a time to talk, even if it appears your student doesn't need to. Middle schoolers are stereotypically reluctant to talk about feelings and fears (but are really good at talking about their perceived rights). This situation is not only alarming, but confusing and complex. Letting them know how you are feeling - even if you're not really sure - is a good way to open the door to a rich conversation. Having said all that, I will borrow some words from the Dalai Lama, XIV to close this newsletter. He is attributed as having said, "There is a saying in Tibetan, 'Tragedy should be utilized as a source of strength.' No matter what sort of difficulties, how painful experience is, if we lose our hope, that's our real disaster." Through dialog, I think, we can cultivate hope.

Dear Parents:

With recent news events involving natural disasters, attacks, and violence, we want to take a moment to remind each of our HES families how very appreciative we are of the loving care and guidance you give your children each day to help them feel heard, valued, nurtured, and safe.

With goals of maximizing learning and having students feel secure, we are pleased that student conversations at HES have *NOT* been particularly elevated with regard to national/international news involving natural disasters and/or senseless violence. (If this were a concern, we'd be implementing supports with a different lens).

For now, here are some quick reminders from the *National Association of School Psychologists*:

- 1. Reassure children that they are safe.
- 2. Make time to talk.
- 3. Keep your explanations developmentally appropriate.
- 4. Review safety procedures.
- Observe children's emotional state.
- 6. Limit television (and social media) viewing of these events.
- 7. Maintain a normal routine.

And one last addition from us:

#8. If you have any specific concerns, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or various support staff to talk things through and determine next steps.

Cyberbullying and Grace's Law

Parents:

Since the beginning of school, I have encountered several situations dealing with Cyberbullying. This is a quick reminder about Grace's Law (Anti-Bullying Law located on page 11 in your child's agenda) so that you can review and discuss this with your children. Grace's Law makes the misuse of interactive computer services a criminal offense. The purpose of the law is to prohibit anyone from using electronic media to engage in conduct that inflicts serious emotional distress on a minor and/or places that minor in reasonable fear of death or serious bodily injury. A person who is found guilty of violating this law is subject to imprisonment up to a year and a fine of up to \$500, or both.

Cyberbullying is bullying using electronic media such as computers, cell phones, and/or game systems. Our digital interconnectedness makes bullying different and more damaging than ever before, because hurtful gossip or photos can be shared widely in a matter of seconds.

If a student is being bullied on a social media site, screen-shot and save the content to share with parents, police, and school administration.

We take all types of bullying seriously. It will take a team effort to identify and correct these actions in order to protect all of our students.

We urge you to protect your family from the flu. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get a flu shot. Please visit www.cdc.gov/flu/index.htm for more information about the flu vaccine.

The clinic at our school will be held on **October 3, 2017**. We will send a notice home the day he/she has been vaccinated.

If you want your child to be vaccinated, please:

- 2. Use your insurance card to <u>fill out your insurance information accurately</u>. Your insurance company will be billed. **There is no co-pay or deductible.** You will NOT be charged by us or your insurance company.
- 3. Read the Vaccine Information Statement (VIS) and talk to your health care provider or the school nurse about any questions you have.
- 4. Return the consent form no later than **September 22, 2017**.

Policy Corner

Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, or Intimidation (Policy 1060)

The Board prohibits acts of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or intimidation because these behaviors compromise the learning environment and well-being of students, staff, and community. Bullying may include the following specific behaviors:

- · Hitting, kicking, shoving, spitting, hair pulling, or throwing something
- Getting another person to hit or harm the student
- Teasing, name-calling, critical remarks, or threatening, in person, by email, or text message
- Bullying by demeaning and making the target of jokes
- Rude and/or threatening gestures
- Intimidation, extortion or exploitation
- Spreading rumors or harmful gossip
- Cyberbullying
- Hazing

Students, parents, employees, and service providers are responsible for reporting violations of this policy that occur on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored activity or event off school property. Incidents of cyberbullying occurring from a student's home that impact another student's well-being at school may also be reported.

Tips for School Success

How to Talk About Bullying

Parents, school staff, and other caring adults have a role to play in preventing bullying. They can:

• **Help kids understand bullying.** Talk about what bullying is and how to stand up to it safely. Tell kids bullying is unacceptable. Make sure kids know how to get help.

- **Keep the lines of communication open.** Check in with kids often. Listen to them. Know their friends, ask about school, and understand their concerns.
- **Encourage kids to do what they love**. Special activities, interests, and hobbies can boost confidence, help kids make friends, and protect them from bullying behavior.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.

Greetings!

This week really flew by! I had the opportunity to get into a lot of classrooms, and I have been so impressed at the level of student engagement and great teacher lessons! Do you have questions about your high schooler's classes? Please contact the teacher directly. MOST teachers' emails are first_last@hcpss.org

This week we submitted our first draft of our School Improvement Plan. Our process is to get feedback from our leadership team, SIT team (including parents and students) and school system leaders and apply that feedback to draft #2. Here's a summary of our draft plan:

NOTE: All high schools in HCPSS have the same three goals (SAT, AP and graduation rate)

- 1. SAT: Increase the numbers of students from all student groups who take the SAT, and have more students hit or exceed the target score of 1065.
- 2. AP: Increase the numbers of students from all student groups who take Advanced Placement (AP) classes, and have more students earn a score of 3, 4, or 5 on the AP exam.
- 3. GRAD RATE: Increase the numbers of students from all student groups who graduate from OMHS.

What are our strategies to get there? We are continuing professional development on the new SAT and the rigorous questioning. We are continuing our professional development on classroom connections to continue to build positive relationships (restorative practices, cultural proficiency and student voice). We will continue to have a teacher focus group for those that teach AP classes, as well. We will keep you posted as our plan is revised, and by November it will be posted to the website.

Our number one priority is the safety of our students. Point of sale for school lunches

Again this year we will be using the POS (Point of Sale) system for students to buy student lunches. Elementary school lunches are available for \$2.75 and milk is available for \$.50. Parents may prepay for student meals by setting up an online account at myschoolbucks.com. The prepay system works very well and we encourage parents to use it. There are two ways to place money into your student account. One, you may go to the website and use a credit card to put money in the account, however there is a service charge. Two, you can send in any amount of money in an envelope marked POS system, our cafeteria manager, Marzela Nurovic, will place this amount of money into the system for you at no extra charge. Students also have the option of paying with cash on a daily basis, but we'd like to encourage the use of the POS system this year, as our paraeducators will not be collecting money each morning. Students will be responsible for holding onto their daily lunch money until it is time for them to eat. Each student has been issued a PIN to use when purchasing meals with cash or prepayment. If a student has forgotten his or her PIN, staff members can look the PIN up by student name. We encourage students to practice their PIN number; they will have this same number until they graduate from High School.

Starting, September 6, if your child is a car rider they will be dismissed from the gym doors at the school. This includes parents that have parked their cars and are walking to the building to pick up their child. Parents are strongly encouraged to remain in the car pool as it is the most efficient way for us to dismiss and ensure children are picked by the appropriate person. Parents will not longer be allowed in the building or at the front doors to pick up their children unless they are doing an early dismissal. Early dismissals should occur prior to 3:30. No vehicles will be allowed to park in the bus lane after 3:30. It is imperative that all parents and guardians follow these procedures to ensure the safety of all the children here at Elkridge Elementary School.

IMPORTANT POLICY INFORMATION

ATTENDANCE (POLICY 9010)

Regular daily attendance is vital to the continuity of classroom instruction and participation in school activities. Therefore, students are required to be in school or to be attending a school activity each day school is in session. In recognition that situations do arise that necessitate absence from school, the Board of Education allow students to be lawfully absent for a death in the family, illness, a court summons, hazardous weather as determined by the Superintendent, work release, religious obligation, declared State emergencies, suspension, or for other emergencies or set of circumstances which in the judgment of the Superintendent or designee constitutes a good and sufficient cause for absence.

Each day we work to recognize and celebrate positive behaviors, but we also must follow the Howard County Public School System countywide discipline code. For your convenience, the HCPSS Student Code of Conduct can be viewed in the Student/Parent Handbook (2017-2018) you received on the first day of school, or online at Student/Parent Handbook. In addition to the information contained in the HCPSS Student Code of Conduct, Mayfield Woods Middle School informs all students, parents/guardians, and staff of the following policies at the beginning of each school year, and at other times when deemed appropriate. The following are summaries of policies related to student responsibilities and behavior, as of July 1, 2017. The most current copies of policies are available on the policies webpage, or through the Public Information Office at 410-313-6682.

Alcohol, Other Drugs, Prescription Medication and Over the Counter Products

(Policy 9230)

The possession, use, or distribution of alcoholic beverages and other drugs on school premises or at school-related or school-sponsored activities is prohibited. Prescription medication and overthe-counter products require written medication orders and are to be administered in accordance with school system Health Services procedures. Legal searches and seizures related to this policy may be conducted on school property. Confidentiality is guaranteed for students who seek counseling for drug or alcohol abuse problems.

For a first offense, a student found using or in possession of alcoholic beverages or other drugs will be suspended from school for not more than 30 school days and will be suspended from attendance at, participation in, and practice for, all extracurricular and school activities for 30 school days. Exclusion from commencement exercises is only applicable if it occurs during the suspension from school. The student will be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program.

A second offense results in a referral to the Superintendent/Designee for a suspension of not more than 45 school days and suspension from attendance at, participation in, and practice for all extracurricular activities for the remainder of the current semester and the next consecutive semester. Exclusion from commencement exercises is only applicable if it occurs during the suspension from school. The student will be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program.

A third violation results in a referral to the Superintendent/Designee for a suspension of not more than 45 school days or expulsion.

Possession or use of prescription medication or over-the-counter products in the absence of, or inconsistent with, a written medication order, will result in a suspension of not more than 30 school days for a first offense. A school administrator may consider a lesser consequence than suspension under certain circumstances.

A second offense may result in suspension from school for up to 30 school days and from attendance at, participation in, and the practice for, all extracurricular and school-related activities for 30 school days. The student may be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program.

A lesser consequence can be considered based on the consequence for the first offense.

A third offense may result in a suspension of up to 45 school days and suspension from attendance at, participation in, and practice for all extracurricular and school-related activities for the remainder of the current semester and the next consecutive semester. The student may be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program. Consequences for a third offense are also dependent on the consequences assigned for the first two offenses.

Students who distribute or intend to distribute alcohol or other drugs on school property will be referred to the Superintendent/Designee for a suspension of not more than 45 school days or expulsion. If suspended, the student also will be suspended from attendance at, participation in, and practice for all extracurricular and school-related activities for the remainder of the semester and the next consecutive semester. The student will be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program.

A second violation results in expulsion.

A school administrator may consider a lesser consequence than suspension if the student distributes an over-the-counter product that can be clearly identified. If this condition is not met, the administrator will suspend the student for not more than 45 school days.

A second offense results in a suspension for not more than 45 school days and suspension from attendance at, participation in, and practice for all extracurricular and school-related activities for the remainder of the semester and the next consecutive semester. The student will be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program.

Subsequent violations will result in suspension of not less than 45 school days or expulsion. If suspended, the student also will be suspended from attendance at, participation in, and practice for all extracurricular and school-related activities for the remainder of the semester and the next consecutive semester. The student will be referred for mandatory counseling in a licensed addictions program.

Attendance

(Policy 9010)

Regular daily attendance is vital to the continuity of classroom instruction and participation in school activities. Therefore, students are required to be in school or to be attending a school activity each day school is in session. In recognition that situations do arise that necessitate absence from school, the Board of Education allows students to be lawfully absent for a death in the family, illness, a court summons, hazardous weather as determined by the Superintendent, work release, religious obligation, declared State emergencies, suspension, or for other emergencies or set of circumstances which in the judgment of the Superintendent or designee constitutes a good and sufficient cause for absence.

Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, or Intimidation

(Policy 1060)

The Board prohibits acts of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or intimidation because these behaviors compromise the learning environment and well-being of students, staff and community.

Bullying may include the following specific behaviors:

- A real or perceived power imbalance.
- Repeated behaviors targeting an individual/group.
- Hitting, kicking, shoving, spitting, hair pulling or throwing something.
- Getting another person to hit or harm the student.
- Teasing, name-calling, critical remarks, or threatening, in person, by email or text message.
- Bullying by demeaning and making the target of jokes.
- Rude and/or threatening gestures.
- Intimidation, extortion or exploitation.
- · Spreading rumors or harmful gossip.
- Cyberbullying.
- Hazing

Students, parents, employees and service providers are responsible for reporting violations of this policy that occur on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored activity or event off school property. Incidents of cyberbullying occurring from a student's home that impact another student's well-being at school may also be reported.

All reports of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment and intimidation will be documented and the student making the report, or an appropriate adult, should complete and submit a Bullying, Harassment, or Intimidation Reporting Form, available on the school system website under Forms. The victim and witnesses will be informed that confidentiality cannot be insured because it is not possible to predict what will be discovered as a result of the investigation. The offender will be informed that retaliation against any victim or bystander is strictly prohibited and that progressive consequences will occur if the activity continues.

Appropriate support services will be provided to a student or staff member exhibiting bullying behaviors or to the victim or bystander. A student or staff member who violates this policy may be required to participate in appropriate counseling or intervention. Consequences range from a parent conference to expulsion.

Electronic Harassment Violation

(not part of Policy 1060)

Using a computer or portable communication device to cause another student/staff member to reasonably fear for his/her safety is prohibited. This includes engaging in conduct that would constitute sexual harassment; to disseminate data with malicious intent to psychologically torment or harass; to make any statement intended to provoke or likely provoke a third party to stalk or harass someone; building a fake profile or website; posing as someone in an electronic chat room, an electronic mail message, or an instant message; repeatedly following the student online or into an electronic chat room; posting or encouraging others to post private, personal, or sexual information pertaining to the individual on the Internet or signing up an individual for inappropriate Internet sites.

Report Bullying

Incidences of bullying may be reported using a printed form (available in each main school office, school counseling office, media center, and health services office or at www.hcpss.org/parents/school-culture-and-climate/report-bullying/) or through HCPSS Sprigeo, an online reporting system, at: http://report.sprigeo.com/.

Civility

(Policy 1000)

The Board has set clear expectations for civil behavior that supports a safe, engaging, and supportive environment on school property and at school-related activities. Unacceptable behaviors include but are not limited to:

- Rude, insulting, or demeaning language and/or actions.
- Persistently unreasonable demands.
- Intrusive and/or interruptive behavior.
- · Displays of temper.
- Harassment and intimidation.
- Threatening and/or abusive gestures and behavior.

Each individual is responsible for behaving in a civil manner and for cooperating in resolving incidents of uncivil behavior.

When resolution is not reached through cooperative agreement, either party involved may cite this policy and notify the other person that they are ending the conversation or the interaction and removing themselves from the situation by ending a phone call, walking out of the room, or requesting the other individual to leave the room.

Discrimination

(Policy 1010)

The Board is committed to providing an educational and work environment that is free from discrimination, fosters equitable opportunities, and values diversity and commonality. To that end, the Board prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, religion, physical or mental disability, age, gender, marital status, or sexual orientation in its educational program, including co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, and in the workplace.

Furthermore, the Board recognizes its responsibility to promote the worth and dignity of all individuals through curriculum, instruction, professional development, and resource selection. Employees and third parties share responsibility for the health, safety, and general welfare of students and for contributing to an environment free from discrimination.

It is a violation of this policy for any student, employee, or third party to engage in acts of discrimination in schools, school system offices, or at school-related activities. It is a violation of this policy to engage in retaliation with regard to allegations of discrimination. Violations of this policy are cumulative; subsequent offenses may affect the nature and severity of the consequences.

Gangs, Gang Activity and Similar Destructive or Illegal Gang Behavior

(Policy 9290)

The Board prohibits any gang activity and any similar destructive or illegal group behavior on school property, on school buses or at school-sponsored functions. This includes reprisal or retaliation against individuals who report gang activity or individuals who are victims, witnesses, bystanders or have reliable information about gang activity.

All suspected violations of this policy will be investigated by school administration. Violations of this policy are cumulative; subsequent offenses may affect the nature and severity of the consequences.

Whenever a report of ongoing or threatened gang-related violence appears accurate and reliable, law enforcement officials will be contacted. Students who violate this policy may be referred to law enforcement officials and may be subject to criminal or other legal action.

Grading and Reporting

(Policies <u>8010</u> and <u>8020</u>)

The Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students meet or exceed rigorous performance standards. Accordingly, grading and achievement information must be determined in a consistent manner and regularly reported to students and their parents. Grading and promotion within the school system is based on the degree of success the individual student has achieved in the educational program. Decisions regarding promotion, retention and acceleration are made based on a student's performance and academic progress over the entire school year.

The grading system for kindergarten through Grade 8 includes evaluation, effort, and instructional codes and/or comments. When the performance of any K-8 student is below grade level, the teacher, with appropriate participation of parents, will develop strategies and apply appropriate interventions to assist the student.

The decision to retain or accelerate a student is based on a number of factors, which are listed in policies 8010 and 8020)

An elementary student who is not performing on grade level in reading and mathematics will automatically be considered for retention.

Middle school students must meet the following requirements or automatically be considered for retention. To pass from one grade to the next, a middle student must pass all courses and receive a final grade of not lower than "C" in English, social studies, reading, mathematics, and science. A student who does not meet this requirement may be recommended to attend summer school. Any student below grade level in reading and/or mathematics at the end of eighth grade will be required to participate in appropriate interventions.

In high school, a 5-letter grading system is used to indicate the achievement of each student in relation to attainment of course objectives. No plus or minus signs are used for official records. The following factors are used in determining level of achievement:

- Competence
- Assignments and preparation
- Participation
- Daily classroom work habits

Note: High school midterm and final examinations may not be taken before the scheduled dates, under any circumstances.

Weighted GPA will be used for academic eligibility for extracurricular activities, National Honor Society, honor roll, and any other activity requiring the reporting of a grade point average.

School staff will communicate with students and parents on a regular basis the level of academic performance in the essential curriculum (Grades K-8) or in relation to attainment of course objectives (Grades 9-12) as measured by county, teacher-made and other assessments, and by teacher observations via individual conferences, progress reports and report cards.

Responsible Use of Technology and Social Media

(Policy 8080)

Students must act in a responsible, civil, ethical, and appropriate manner when using technology for HCPSS-sanctioned activities. Students may not reveal personally identifiable information (e.g., home phone numbers, addresses, or social security numbers) except in specific circumstances where such information is required to complete academic assignments. In such circumstances, prior written consent from the parent or legal guardian of the student is required.

Students will access only those network resources for which they have obtained permission, using the account assigned to them.

Students will not create, access, download, store, or print content that:

- Depicts profanity, obscenity, the use of weapons, terrorism, or violence.
- Promotes use of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or other illegal or harmful products.
- Contains sexually suggestive messages.
- Is sexually explicit or obscene.
- Depicts gang affiliation.
- Contains language or symbols that demean an identifiable person or group or otherwise infringe on the rights of others.
- Causes or is likely to cause a disruption to school activities or the orderly operation of the school.
- Contains rude, disrespectful, or discourteous expressions inconsistent with civil discourse or behavior.
- Constitutes bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or intimidation in violation of <u>Policy 1040</u> Safe School Environments, or <u>Policy 1060</u> Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, or Intimidation.

If a student, while using HCPSS-sanctioned technology or social media, discovers that another student may be the target of bullying, stalking or other harmful behavior, the student must report the findings to a teacher or administrator.

The school system reserves the right to enable or disable interactive features on social media to remove content that is inconsistent with the stated purpose, mission, and guidelines posted for the use of social media. The school system may access, monitor, archive, audit, purge or disclose the public contents of material that is created, stored or accessed through personal social media when possible and permitted by law.

Failure by any student to comply with this policy will result in the temporary or permanent termination of technology access privileges, in addition to any applicable disciplinary action or financial obligation.

Personal Communication Device Guidelines

- 1. Students must comply with class and school rules and all relevant HCPSS Board Policies.
- Administration, faculty, and staff may request at any time that students must turn off and put away technology devices.
 Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action and possible revocation of privileges.
- Individuals assume full responsibility for their non-HCPSS owned technology devices. This includes the device's safety, security and maintenance.
- 4. Schools may designate approved personal communication device zones/times on school grounds; however, personal communication devices may not be used in locker rooms or bathrooms at any time.
- Students must obtain consent from staff and participants before taking, uploading or sharing photos, recording audio, or capturing video during the school day.
- 6. Any disruption to class or other educational activity may result in disciplinary action.
- 7. Privileges for personal communication devices vary according

to grade level:

- Elementary school students are permitted to have personal communication devices in their backpacks during the school day. They must be turned off during school hours. They may use their personal communication devices before or after school hours. Students may use personal communication devices in the front office or classroom with the permission of the classroom teacher/administrator.
- Middle school students are permitted to carry personal communication devices with them during the school day. They must be turned off or in silent mode at all times. These devices may not disrupt instruction times and should be put away (in a pocket, backpack, notebook, or locker). Instructional time is defined as from the sound of the class late bell to the sound of the class dismissal bell. Students may use their personal communication device before or after school hours, during lunch, and hallway/transition times. Due to the size of middle school hallways, middle school principals may choose to limit the use of personal communication devices during hallway transitions in an effort to maintain a safe environment.
- High school students are permitted to carry personal communication devices with them during the school day. They must be turned off or in silent mode at all times. These devices may not disrupt instructional times and should be put away (in a pocket, backpack, notebook, or locker). Instructional time is defined as from the sound of the class late bell to the sound of the class dismissal bell. High school students may use their personal communication devices before or after school hours, during lunch, and during hallway/transition times.

Student Access to Digital Tools

Throughout the school year, your child will have access to a number of educational digital tools for instruction and HCPSS sanctioned activities. HCPSS has contracted with several essential digital tools and online service providers that comply with student privacy laws, such as Canvas, Google Apps for Education, and eTexts. These digital tools provide teachers and students a variety of ways to engage in the teaching and learning process. Some of the digital tools will enable students and teachers to enter and share digital content. While using these services, students will learn about safe and effective positive digital citizen practices for interacting online.

Additional authorized supplemental digital tools or online services may be used to enhance instruction. Supplementary digital tools are only authorized if the vendor's terms of service and privacy policy are consistent with federal and state student data privacy protections. Each teacher's Canvas course page will reflect the supplemental digital tools being used by the class. If there is a specific supplementary digital tool that you do not want your child to use, please contact your child's teacher or the school administrator.

Safe and Supportive Schools

(Policy 1040)

The Board of Education is committed to providing a safe, engaging, and supportive school climate. Behaviors that compromise this commitment, interfere with school operations, or are otherwise contrary to the basic mission of public schools will not be tolerated.

Any behaviors that interfere with or threaten the physical, emotional, mental, or academic well-being of students or employees will be addressed through the application of the appropriate Board policy and the HCPSS Student Code of Conduct, even when they do not occur on school property or at a school-related activity.

Students, employees and third parties engaging in these behaviors are subject to disciplinary and/or legal action. Students who violate this policy may also be subject to appropriate educational interventions and/or counseling.

Sexual Discrimination

(Policy 1020)

The Board of Education of Howard County is committed to providing an educational and work environment that is free from sexual discrimination. To that end, the Board of Education prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in its educational program, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, and in the workplace, as required by law.

Employees and third parties share responsibility for the health, safety and general welfare of students; for contributing to a school environment free from sexual discrimination; and for maintaining appropriate relationships with students. Employees, students, and third parties may be subject to disciplinary action or consequences for inappropriate behavior of a sexual nature, even when the behavior does not rise to the level of sexual discrimination as defined by prevailing federal and state laws.

It is a violation of this policy for any student, employee, or third party to engage in sexual discrimination or to engage in retaliation with regard to complaints of sexual discrimination.

Sexual discrimination includes sexual harassment, sexual assault and sexual violence and is characterized as unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature that interferes with a student's ability to learn, study, work, achieve, or participate in school activities or with an employee's/ third party's term, condition, or privilege of employment/ relationship with the school system. Sexual discrimination can be committed by a student, employee, or third party.

Sexual harassment is unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature. Examples of sexual harassment include, but are not limited to: offensive language verbally or in writing, including electronic formats; visual harassment such as derogatory posters, photography, cartoons, drawings, clothing or gestures; unwelcome sexual advances; spreading rumors about or evaluating someone for their sexual behavior; taunting or ridiculing someone because of perceived or actual sexual orientation; or pressuring someone for sexual activity.

Sexual assault is unwanted sexual contact or threat. Examples of sexual assault include, but are not limited to: unwanted touching of a person's body in a sexual way without the person's consent such as patting, pinching, or impeding or blocking a person's physical movement, or engaging in unwelcome sexual contact. Sexual violence is any type of contact that occurs without the explicit consent of the recipient such as fondling, forced sexual intercourse, sexual battery, rape, molestation or incest.

A student who chooses to file a sexual discrimination complaint must do so orally or in writing with a teacher, school counselor, school-based administrator, or the Title IX Coordinator for action in accordance with established procedures. All such reports must be filed with or forwarded to the Title IX Coordinator who will oversee and support the investigation.

A school system employee or third party who chooses to file a sexual harassment complaint must do so with the Title IX Coordinator or with a school-based administrator or supervisor as appropriate. All such reports must be forwarded to the Title IX Coordinator for investigation.

In each phase of complaint resolution, every reasonable effort shall be made to maintain the confidentiality and protect the privacy of all parties. These efforts may be limited by the school system's legal and regulatory obligation to investigate and address allegations of sexual discrimination.

Upon completion of an investigation of a complaint received, the investigator will send a prompt, written report of the findings and actions to be taken, if any, to the appropriate parties. Such reporting will follow established confidentiality guidelines.

Violations of this policy are cumulative; subsequent offenses may affect the nature and severity of the consequences. Use and/or exhaustion of these procedures is not a prerequisite for the filing of complaints with the federal Office for Civil Rights.

Student Assault and/or Battery on Staff

(Policy 9270)

In order for learning to take place, the school environment must be safe and orderly. Therefore, any assault and/or battery by a student on a school staff member is strictly forbidden. An assault may be physical, oral or written. Battery I is the unlawful touching of another person by the aggressor and battery II involves unlawful touching plus a display of blatant disregard for the safety of the staff member or others.

Consequences for an assault violation range from a minimum of inschool suspension to expulsion. A battery I violation results in a referral to the Superintendent/Designee for a suspension of not more than 45 days. A first battery II offense results in a referral to the Superintendent/Designee for an extended suspension between 11 and 45 school days or expulsion. A second battery II offense also results in a referral to the Superintendent/Designee for extended suspension between 11 and 45 school days or expulsion. A student who violates this policy is ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities for the duration of a suspension or expulsion.

Student Discipline

(Policy 9200)

The Board of Education recognizes that student discipline regulations should reflect a continuum of progressive discipline and a rehabilitative discipline philosophy with the goals of fostering, teaching, and acknowledging positive behavior and should be designed to keep students connected to school so that they may graduate college and career ready.

Student behavior is the shared responsibility of the school, the student, and the home. The professional staff at a school has the responsibility for taking appropriate action when a student is involved in a situation that is not conducive to a safe, engaging, and orderly environment.

Disciplinary consequences should be progressive in nature and designed to change inappropriate behavior, encourage responsible actions, and promote the development of self-discipline. The student has the right to due process. The Board of Education has approved the following forms of discipline:

- Alternative Educational Setting A setting outside of the home school designed to accommodate the needs of students who have demonstrated the need for significant academic or behavioral support.
- Detention The placement of a student in a non-standard, supervised setting during the school day, before or after school

or on Saturdays.

- Restricted Access Limitation of a student's presence on school property.
- Suspension The denial of a student's right to attend regular classes or school for a specified period of time for cause.
 Suspension includes extended suspension, in school suspension, short-term suspension, or long-term suspension.
 - In-School Suspension The removal of a student within the school building from the student's current education program to another location within the school building for up to but not more than 10 school days in a school year for disciplinary reasons as determined by the principal.
 - Short-Term Suspension The removal of a student from school for up to but not more than 3 school days for disciplinary reasons as determined by the principal.
 - Long Term Suspension The removal of a student from school for 4-10 school days for disciplinary reasons as determined by the principal.
 - Extended-Suspension The exclusion of a student from school for 11-45 school days for disciplinary reasons as determined by the Superintendent/ Designee
- In-school Intervention The opportunity afforded a student, after the student is removed to an alternate location within the school, to continue to:
 - Appropriately progress in the general curriculum.
 - Receive the special education and related services specified on the student's IEP if the student is a student with a disability in accordance with COMAR 13A.05.01.
 - Receive instruction commensurate with the program afforded to the student in the regular classroom.
 - Participate with peers as they would in their current education program to the extent appropriate.
- Expulsion The exclusion of a student from the student's regular school program for 45 school days or longer as determined by the Superintendent/Designee. Expulsion may occur when the Superintendent/Designee has determined that the student's return to school prior to the completion of the expulsion period would pose an imminent threat of serious harm to other students, staff, or others.
- This policy applies during school hours as well as at other times and places, including but not limited to, school buses, school-sponsored events, field trips, athletic functions, and any other activity where school administrators have jurisdiction over students. Other procedures may apply when a student is receiving special education services or has a 504 plan.

Disciplinary action may also be taken for off-campus incidents in accordance with <u>Policy 9280</u>, Students Charged with Community or Reportable Offenses as well as violations of <u>Policy 1060</u>, Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment or Intimidation.

Any student who is suspended from school is precluded from attendance at or participation in extracurricular or school-related activities during the period of the suspension or expulsion. When a graduating senior is suspended for 10 days or less, and the period of suspension includes the day of commencement, the student may appeal directly to the Superintendent.

Student Dress Code

Policy 9210

Student dress and appearance are the basic responsibility of students and their parents/guardians as long as they are consistent with the school system's responsibility to ensure that school environments are healthy, safe and conducive to student learning. It is a violation of this policy for any student to wear attire that interferes with the educational mission of the schools, is disruptive to the school environment, or that could endanger the health or safety of that student or others during school hours and school activities. This includes, but is not limited to, attire that:

- Unduly exposes or reveals skin or undergarments. This may include: tank tops; halter tops; tops that are strapless, low cut, or expose the midriff; pants worn low or loose that expose skin or undergarments.
- Causes or is likely to cause a substantial or material disruption to school activities or the orderly operation of the school. This may include buttons, display bands, armbands, flags, decals or other badges of symbolic expression.
- Covers the head, including hats, sunglasses, bandanas, hoods and visors, or head coverings of any kind.

- Depicts profanity, obscenity, the use of weapons, or violence.
- Promotes use of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or other illegal or harmful products.
- Promotes, implies or contains sexually suggestive messages.
- Depicts gang affiliation.
- Contains language or symbols that demean an identifiable person or group or infringe on the rights of others.
- Contains rude, disrespectful, or discourteous expressions inconsistent with civil discourse and behavior.
- May damage school property.

Attire worn for medical reasons or required in practicing a religious belief is permitted. Student attire will support a healthy and safe academic school environment.

Any student failing to comply with the direction of an administrator is subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Policy

Discipline and the Student Code of Conduct.

Students' Rights and Responsibilities

(Policy 9020)

The rights and responsibilities of individuals are preserved through the protection and preservation of the rights of others. Students have a responsibility for their own learning, for their personal conduct, and for the manner in which they exercise their rights. Students must accept the consequences of their actions. Students have the responsibility to participate in the educational program offered by their schools and, in doing so, are bound by the policies of the Howard County Public School System.

Students have specific responsibilities and rights related to school attendance, student expression, disciplinary action, due process, search and seizure, student records, student activities, use of school facilities, and non-discriminatory practices.

Student Representation

(Policy 2010)

The Board of Education recognizes the value of contributions of students in the regular meetings of the Board and encourages this participation by establishing the position of Student Member to the Board of Education of Howard County and by establishing the position of student representative in each high school. The Student Member is elected by a plurality of student voters in Grades 6 through 11 countywide and serves a one-year term beginning with the first regularly scheduled meeting of the Board in July. Student representatives are elected in their high schools and serve a one-year term.

Attire worn for medical reasons or required in practicing a religious belief is permitted. Student attire will support a healthy and safe academic school environment.

Any student failing to comply with the direction of an administrator is subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Policy

Discipline and the Student Code of Conduct.

Student Search and Seizure

(Policy 9260)

Authorized school officials have the right to search students, their possessions, and automobiles during the school day and at school-related activities when the school official has a reasonable belief that the student possesses an impermissible item. Additionally, authorized school officials may search property assigned to a student for school use, such as lockers, desks, electronic devices, and cubbies, at any time.

Students Charged with Community or Reportable Offenses

(Policy 9280)

The presence in school of a student who has been charged with a reportable offense or an offense related to membership in a criminal gang may compromise the safety and well being of students and/or staff, and may disrupt the educational process in the school. Students who are considered by school administrators to have engaged in community offenses may raise similar concerns.

Maryland law requires law enforcement agencies to inform the superintendents of local school systems when a student has been charged with a reportable offense or an offense related to membership in a criminal gang. The information is then shared with the principal of the school the student attends, who conducts an investigation.

A student may be disciplined under this policy when the school system has evidence of the offense in addition to the notice of charges and when the student's presence in school raises concerns for the safety and well being of students and/ or staff or the order and general welfare of the school. If it is determined that the student poses no threat to the safety and well being of students and staff, no further action is necessary.

However, if deemed appropriate, the student may be disciplined and/or assigned to an alternative educational placement pending adjudication. If the student is suspended from school, the principal will promptly inform the student's parent(s) of the suspension. If the decision is made to place the student in an alternative educational setting, the student may not participate in extracurricular and school-related activities of his or her home school during the time in the alternative placement. While in the alternative placement, the student's performance and status related to any legal proceedings will be reviewed on a quarterly basis. Adjustments are made as appropriate.

Tobacco-Free Environment

(Policy 1050)

The use or possession, or sale of any tobacco product, cigarette rolling papers, or electronic cigarette products by students is prohibited on school property (school buildings, school vehicles, school bus stops), at school-related activities, and on school trips to other areas or countries at all times.

For a first violation, the student and his/her parent will receive a referral form for a tobacco use cessation program administered by a public health agency or private provider. Failure to attend the tobacco use cessation program will result in a Level 3 Response as

defined in the HCPSS Student Code of Conduct. For a second offense, the student will be given a suspension from one to three school days. The student will have the option of enrolling in a tobacco use cessation program administered by a public health agency or private provider instead of serving the suspension. The school administrator will provide the parent with a referral form for that program. If the student chooses this option, proof of enrollment must be provided to the school administrator. If proof of enrollment is not provided within five school days, the student will be required to serve the designated length of suspension.

A student who violates this policy a third time may be given a suspension for three school days. The student will have the option of enrolling in a tobacco use cessation program administered by a public health agency or private provider instead of serving the three-day suspension. The school administrator will provide the parent with a referral form for that program. If the student chooses this option, proof of enrollment must be provided to a school administrator. If proof of enrollment is not provided within five school days, the student will be required to serve the designated length of suspension.

For fourth and subsequent offenses, the student may be given a suspension for three to five school days. The student may choose to serve the suspension or to enroll in and complete a tobacco use cessation program administered by a public health agency or private provider. If the student chooses this option, proof of enrollment must be provided to the school administrator before the student can return to school. If proof of enrollment and completion are not provided, the student will be required to serve the designated length of suspension.

Trespassing or Willful Disturbance

(Policy 3020)

The school system has the legal authority to take action when anyone willfully disturbs or otherwise prevents the orderly conduct of school system instruction, administration or activities. Additionally, Maryland law provides criminal penalties for any individual who trespasses on school property or fails to leave school property after being asked to do so by authorized personnel.

Any willful disturbance or interference with the orderly conduct of activities, including bodily harm or threats of bodily harm to an individual who is lawfully on school property; threats to a student or employee by any means including in-person, by telephone, or by electronic means; or any willful damage or defacing of school property or building is a violation of policy and may be a violation of the law.

Any individual who is found to be on school property after receiving prior legal notice that his/her access to school system property has been denied, or who remains on the property after being asked to leave, is considered to be trespassing.

When an individual commits any of the offenses noted above, the building administrator may take several actions:

- Explain how the individual's behavior is unacceptable.
- Issue a warning letter to the individual.
- Issue a letter that summarizes the disruptive behavior and any prior discussions or warnings and which informs the individual that any further incidents will lead to a formal denial of access.
- Issue a denial-of access letter.

When a denial-of-access letter is issued to the parent of a student enrolled at the school, the letter will explain how the parent may continue to discuss legitimate school issues regarding his or her child.

Weapons

(Policy 9250)

The presence of weapons on school property poses a serious threat to the safety and well being of students and staff. It is unlawful for any person to carry or possess any rifle, gun, knife, or deadly weapon of any kind on any public school property in the state of Maryland. A weapon, as defined by school system policy, includes: any gun, dirk knife, bowie knife, switchblade knife, star knife, buck knife, hunting knife, throwing star, razor, metal knuckle, Nunchaku, explosive device, or any other object or implement intended to cause harm to another or used in such a way as to cause harm to another. Any student found in possession of a weapon on school property will be suspended and the police notified. Possession of a gun, or any implement possessed under a circumstance that would reasonably lead a person to believe it was a gun, will result in expulsion.

manage an HCPSS News account. All subscription information comes directly from the <u>HCPSS Connect</u> system.

Family File - You should have completed your FAMILY FILE by now. If not, please go to http://www.hcpss.org/connect/ today to complete this important information. Family File replaces the "Emergency Card" from previous years, and more. If you have not yet completed your Family File, please do so now. Emergencies can happen at any time. Please take 10 minutes to complete your Family File today!

HCPSS Student & Parent Handbook - Your child received a booklet titled "HCPSS Student & Parent Handbook." We encourage you to especially review the following policies with your child(ren): Student Code of Conduct, Grading & Reporting, Responsible Use of Technology, and Student Dress Code. We have reviewed policies on bullying and weapons with each grade level. Also, keep this handbook in a safe place to use as reference for the entire school year.

Please be aware that Policy 9210 – Student Dress Codes addresses hats and head gear. While we have allowed some head gear in the past, we have observed that head gear has become more ornate and increasingly distracting over time. In order to ensure that our classrooms are conducive to student learning, we are asking our students to follow the policy and refrain from wearing headgear including, hats, visors, hoods, headbands with ears, pompoms or other decorations, sunglasses, or head coverings of any kind. Flat headbands and barrettes are permissible. Teachers will kindly ask student to remove head gear and place it in their back pack during the day. Please review this policy with your child(ren). You will be notified of any special events throughout the year when head gear may be worn by all students.

School-Wide Classroom Management Process – New for 2017-2018

We would like to take this opportunity to share the classroom management process that is being implemented at St. John's Lane Elementary beginning this school year. This process, 1-2-3 Magic, is a research-based program that was developed by Dr. Thomas Phelan, a clinical psychologist. 1-2-3 Magic incorporates a specific counting technique and time out system to stop undesirable behavior while encouraging positive behavior. Some of you may be familiar with Dr. Phelan's work as his original research was designed for parents. This program aligns closely with our emphasis on Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) and our use of the growth mindset. Spot-O

Grams will still be used. The HCPSS Discipline Policy will still be followed.

There are three steps involved in the implementation of 1-2-3 Magic.

Step 1 involves managing undesirable behavior by counting to 1, 2, or 3. Reaching a 1 or 2 is a reminder point to the child about making better choices. On the count of 3, the student must "Take 5," which indicates moving to a designated classroom area to reflect and to prepare to rejoin his/her peers. While implementing the steps, the teacher follows a No-Talking and No-Emotions rule. If your child continues to have a difficult time making good choices after the "Take 5," the teacher will fill out a Minor Incident Form. This form will be sent home for your signature. The Minor Incident Form is the communication to parents that their child did not make good choices after direct reminders utilizing the 1,2,3 Magic process.

Step 2 involves encouraging positive behavior. The staff will provide specific positive praise and give Spot-O-Grams throughout the school day. Students save these tickets to trade-in for a variety of rewards, including tangible and non-tangible choices. Our Positive Behavioral Intervention Support (PBIS) team will serve as a resource to support school, grade, and individual needs.

Step 3 involves using valuable tools for maintaining healthy relationships with children, including active listening, shared fun, and monthly & quarterly celebrations.

All of these steps work together and contribute to a positive classroom climate where your child will feel welcomed and comfortable, and where he or she will work proudly and learn productivity. More severe incidents will involve office referrals and consequences based on the Howard County Public School System Student Code of Conduct.

- **School Hours, Student Drop Off and Pick-up:** School doors open at 8:35am with the instructional day beginning at 8:45am. Students who arrive after 8:45am will be marked as tardy. Students may not enter the building until 8:35am when the

entrance bell rings. Between 8:00am-8:35am, staff are involved in professional duties and are not available for supervision of students. If your child is dropped off at school before 8:35am, he/she will be waiting outside in an unsupervised environment. For your child's safety, we must ask you to refrain from dropping children off at school before 8:35AM.

- School is dismissed at 3:15pm. Buses typically leave our lot by 3:25pm. If your child has a change in the expected dismissal on any day, the office must receive a written note from the parent. *The school will not accept a student's verbal report of a change in dismissal at any time.* If you need to pick your child up from school during the school hours, you must come into the front office and your child will be called to the office for you. The instructional day does not allow for students to be called to the office to wait for the parent to arrive. Please plan your schedule accordingly. Front office personnel will not call students to the office for early dismissal until the parent is present in the office.
- Student birthdays are celebrated each morning by announcing the child's name as part of the morning announcements and then the student comes to the office for a special birthday pencil. In alignment with the HCPSS Health & Wellness Policies, food items are not permitted for birthday celebrations. In lieu of a food item, you may send in non-edible items such as stickers, pencils, erasers, or, your child may wish to donate a book to the classroom library or media center in honor of his/her special day. No balloons or food of any kind may be brought into the classroom/school. Unapproved food items sent to the classroom will be sent back home.
- Party Invitations Invitations to birthday or other personal events should not take place at school. Please do not send your child to school with invitations for birthdays or parties. Invitations should be delivered outside of school. A school directory is being compiled by the PTA and will come home in the near future. This may be used to contact your child's classmates during the year for these types of activities.
- **Student Mailboxes in Classrooms** Many classrooms have student mailboxes. If you are volunteering in your child's classroom, please do not use the student mailboxes for delivering personal notes or personal items. Personal items should be delivered outside of school.
- Riding a Different Bus A change in a student's bus can only be made with an administrator's approval. We cannot approve bus changes for play dates and/or parties. In a true emergency, please put your request in writing and an administrator will contact you. We want our students to be safe. In the event of a bus accident, we need to know who is on each bus. Our bus capacity is also based on the number of children at each stop; so adding a student to a bus for even a day can create safety issues.

- **Walkers** may not travel to a bus stop to get on a bus and ride it to school. Only assigned students may ride their assigned bus.
- Asking for Student Work During Student Absence When students are absent from school, missed work will be sent home upon their return to school, within 48 hours. This includes absences for illness, or otherwise. Requests will not be necessary. Please do not request work in anticipation of your child's absence. We will not send work home before the student has returned to school unless the student has been out due to illness more than three consecutive days.
- Parking on SOUTHVIEW ROAD HC Police Patrol Operations have informed us that while it is permissible to park on Southview Road for school events, it is not permissible to park on the grass since this is private property. SJLES has no authority or influence over the parking on Southview Road. When parking for school events, please be considerate of the residents and do not park on the grass. Our neighbors on Southview Road thank you in advance for your cooperation.
- Parking IN FRONT of THE BUILDING Please do not park in front of the building against the <u>red curbs</u>. This is the fire lane and cannot be accessed if blocked. We have had incidents in the past when an emergency vehicle could not pull to the curb because of parked cars. This impacts the safety of everyone in the building.
- **BUILDING USE -** Any group requesting use of the building at any time of day or evening MUST complete a Building Usage form which can be downloaded from the Parent section of the HCPSS website. There are no forms in the school building and the forms are not completed by school personnel. Approval for building usage does not come from the school.
- **CAR LOOP -** Before the 8:35am arrival bell, the car loop will be open on the entrance side only to allow cars to drive into the loop and wait there. The exit side of the car loop <u>will not be open</u> until staff arrives for supervision at 8:35am. At 8:35am, when staff supervision begins, the car loop <u>exit</u> will open and the car loop will be in motion. For safety reasons, the car loop will not be in motion before 8:35am.
- CAR LOOP DROP OFF When driving into the car loop in the morning and/or in the afternoon, please pull all the way forward to the end of the loop which will allow the most relief possible to the back-up on St. John's Lane. Be sure that your children are exiting your car on the passenger side ONLY. It is extremely dangerous for children to exit on to the road and then walk over the sidewalk. There are staff assigned to help your child exit the car on to the sidewalk safely.

It is crucial that parents dropping-off/picking up students adhere to the following rules in order to maintain the highest level of 1) safety for the students and 2) courtesy to those behind you:

- 1. If you intend to get out of your car, use a parking space and stay out of the drop-off line. If you are in the line, stay in your car.
- 2. Wait until you are in the loop to drop off students. Do not try to drop off students in the double line.
- 3. Mind the gaps. Pull all of the way to the end of the loop before loading out of courtesy to those behind you.
- 4. Drivers in the first line should stay to the right to allow space for the second line.
- 5. The second line should be mindful to leave space to your left at the entrance of the lot for traffic to exit the parking lot.

Safety and courtesy will be maximized if <u>ALL</u> drivers follow these rules.

BULLYING PREVENTION- St. John's Lane Elementary is committed to providing a safe and nurturing environment for all students. Preventing and responding to Bullying is an important part of this goal. We provide a variety of initiatives to teach students, families and staff about bullying prevention. Through character education, specific guidance lessons in the classroom and our Positive Behavior, Intervention and Supports (PBIS), students learn conflict resolution and assertiveness skills while further developing empathy and respect. Professional development for staff and information provided for families also assist us in our efforts to keep students safe from bullying. If you believe your child is being bullied, please refer to the Student/Parent Handbook that you received this week and available on the https://preceived.org mediation, you may complete a Bullying, Harassment, or Intimidation Reporting Form which can be obtained in our front office, guidance office, health room or media center, or downloaded from the hcpss.org website, or online at report.sprigeo.com.

VOLUNTEERS- Your child's classroom teacher will provide information for you about volunteer opportunities to support the classroom and our school. Maryland State Law requires that Volunteers, including Parent Volunteers, complete annual Child Abuse Training prior to serving as a volunteer in any school. Each SJLES volunteer must complete the HCPSS Child Abuse Training and Confidentiality Training prior to volunteering. Please use the link found on our website httpss.sjles.org to view this training presentation under *Get Involved*. Once you have viewed each slide, please fill out the certificate of completion and print two copies. Return one copy to your child's teacher and one copy to the front office at St. John's Lane Elementary School. Thank you again for supporting our school as a volunteer and helping to ensure that each of our students remains safe.

Building Safety and Security

Please read each bullet point **carefully** and make a commitment to following the SJLES security procedures each and every time. Thank you for doing your part to keep our school safe and secure for everyone.

- The school entryway contains a camera buzz-in system at our front doors. Use the call button on the right side of the vestibule and you will be helped by the front office staff.
- When you enter our front office you will sign-in using our Visitor Management system. This is an electronic system that will read your drivers license and then create a photo ID badge for you. You will also use this system to exit the building.
- All visitors to the school MUST state their purpose for visiting, sign-in, receive a visitor's badge and sign-out each and every time they visit the school. Except for the students and HCPSS employees, every person that comes into our building, at any time, is considered a visitor. Be prepared to be stopped by staff and asked to return to the front office for a visitor's badge. All visitors should be prepared to show photo identification upon request. When persons are known to us, we will not necessarily ask for photo identification at each visit, but you must still state your purpose, sign-in and receive a visitor's badge.
- After 8:45 AM, all entrances are locked. Entrance and exit to the building may only
 occur from the main doors by the front office. If you discover an unlocked or open
 door, <u>please close it</u> and report this to the front office immediately.
- There should be no cars driving into the bus loop between the hours of 2:45 PM and 3:15 PM. Please do not attempt to drive into the bus loop during this time OR to walk in the bus loop during this time. We have seen parents walking students to parked cars through the bus loop. This is an *extremely hazardous* practice. You cannot be seen behind and/or between buses and other vehicles lining the loop.
- Many parents email the front office secretaries with notices, requests, etc. Please email <u>ALL</u> of the secretaries when you have a notice sent through email. If your message is only sent to one secretary, there is no way to know if that one secretary you emailed will be in that day to open your email in time to act on your request or information. - When sending notes to school, please DATE your note, include your child's FIRST & LAST NAME and the TEACHER'S NAME. Without this information, it is very hard to determine whom the note is about when the note comes to the front office. Reread your note to be sure it is accurate and clear to the school staff.
