Thank you for following up. I am very much in favor of the change. Right now you can be advanced in just two of the four academic categories, I don't believe that is enough. In addition, we often get parents who claim that the preschool teacher unfairly put their child's score too low or now the teacher would rate the child higher. Assuming the parent rates the child high, it would take this argument out of the equation as one or the two or both of the two developmental checklists scoring advanced would now mean the same thing.

You may remember a discussion we had after the assessment window last year, regarding our scoring methods... we were talking about possibly adjusting the scoring method...

Currently, students must score 4 Advanced (out of 6 categories), and no Basics. The 6 categories include 4 tested academic areas and 2 developmental checklists (parent and teacher).

We debated whether or not it might be wise to add that at least 3 of the 4 advanced must be academic areas... (knowing that most parents score their children very high)...

I think there are reasons both for and against this but had a note to myself that we wanted to consider it for this year. Would love to hear your thoughts... as well as input from the rest of you.

The current testing window is coming to a close and we will be scoring soon, then sending out letters at the end of the month.
