Where are they going?

HCPSS Class of 2018: 13 graduates with at least 30 college credits completed

- Ten plan to enroll at HCC for Fall of 2018
- Other colleges: University of Maryland College Park, University of Maryland Baltimore County

HCPSS Class of 2018: 15 graduates with 30 college credits completed

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## Increasing Our Impact

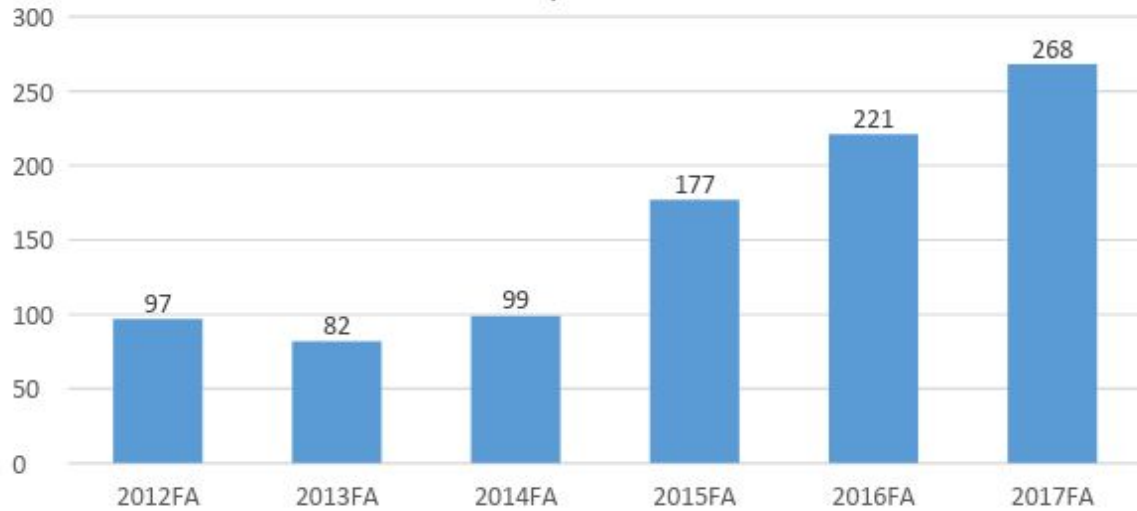
2017 - 2018: 268 students engaged in dual enrollment initiatives in the Fall term and 663 students in Winter/Spring

2018 - 2019: ~1,300 students are projected to engage in dual enrollment initiatives

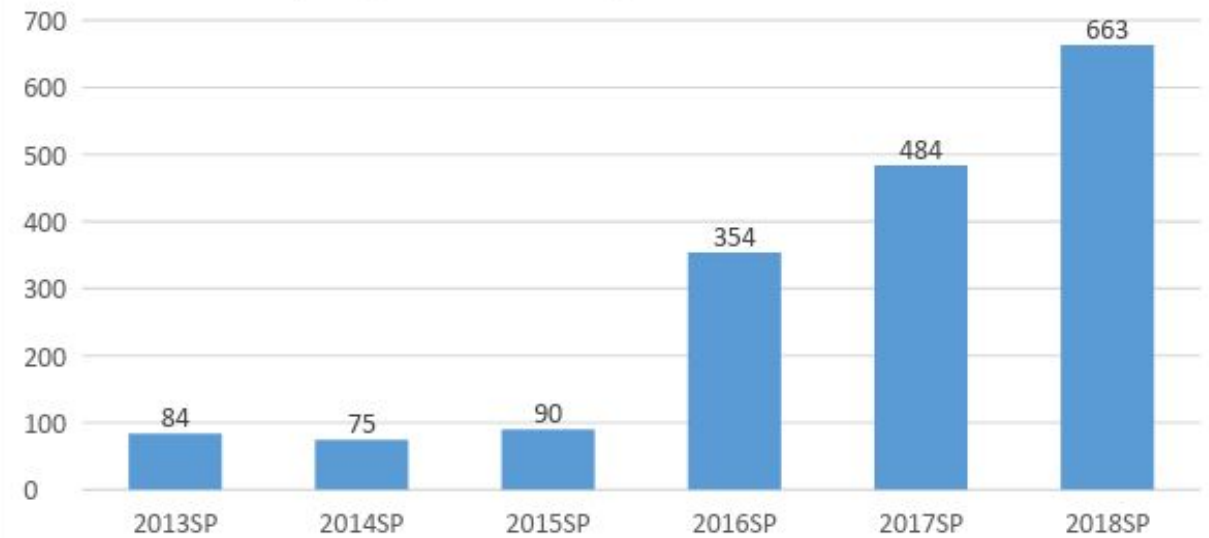


# *Jump*Start Enrollment Data

# *JumpStart* Research - First Generation

- Where low SES groups and first-generation college students *are* supported with the costs of dual enrollment, the benefits are clear:
  - The % of first-generation students who attain any postsecondary degree is 8 percentage points higher if they participated in dual enrollment than not. (An, 2012).
  - A similar result was found for B.A. attainment. (An, 2012).

# *JumpStart* Students Receiving FARMs

Since 2013, 116 HCPSS students with financial need, have completed college courses at HCC. This opportunity was previously beyond reach of families.

Early College - Cybersecurity:

- Cohort 1: 3 students
- Cohort 2: 2 students
- Cohort 3: 1 student

Early College - STEM:

- Cohort 1: 6 students
- Cohort 2: 2 students
- Cohort 3: 2 students



# *JumpStart* Research - Outcomes

Dual-enrollment supports retention and completion:

- Dual enrollees are more likely to persist in college and attain a college degree than non-dual enrollees (Karp et al., 2007; Morrison, 2008; Swanson, 2008).
- Morrison (2008) estimates that participation in dual enrollment increases the odds of attaining an associate's degree by 61%.
- Dual enrollees are 16% to 20% more likely to attain a bachelor's degree than non-dual enrollees (Swanson 2008).



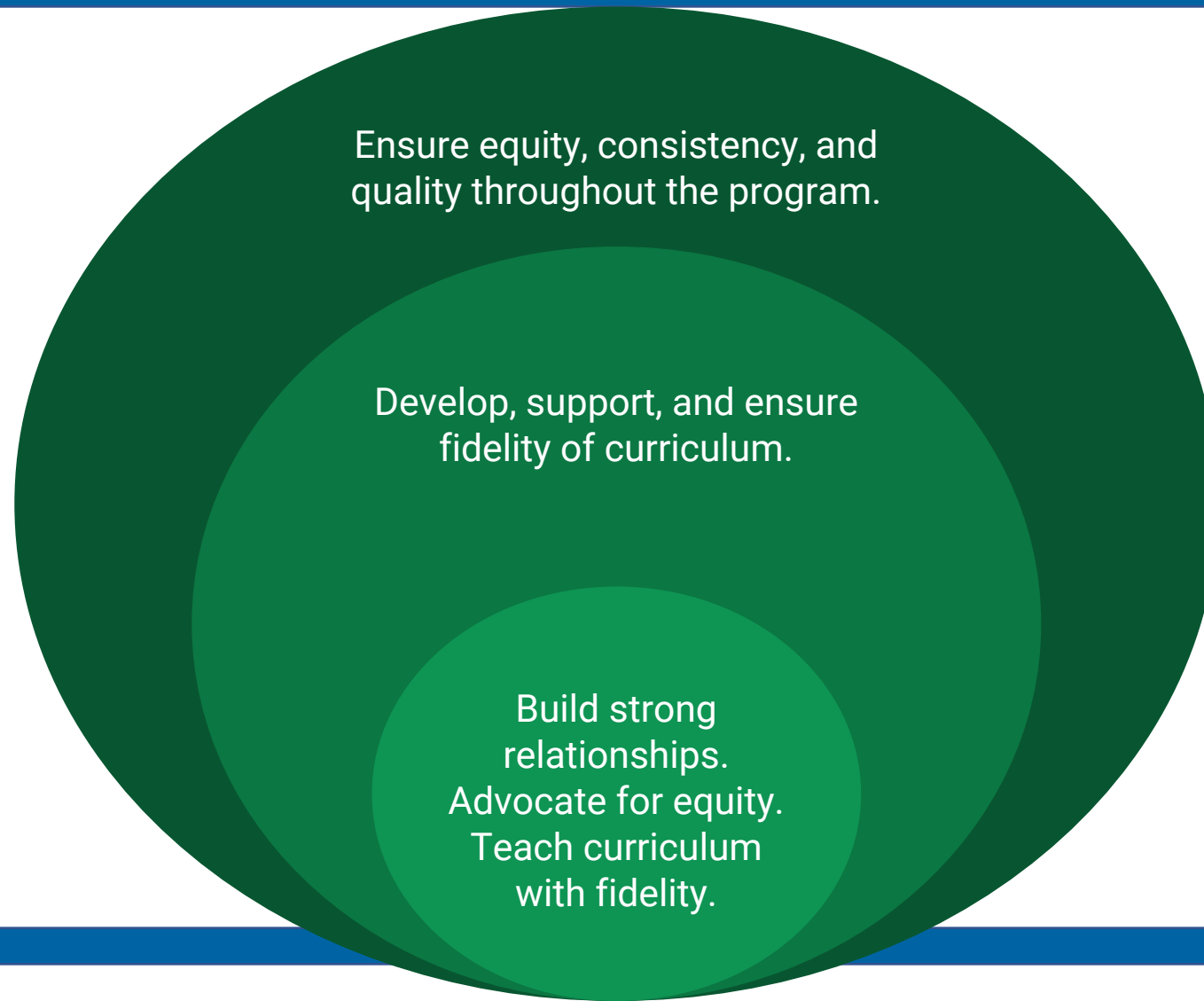
# *JumpStart* Higher Education Outcomes



HCPSS students enrolled at HCC perform well academically

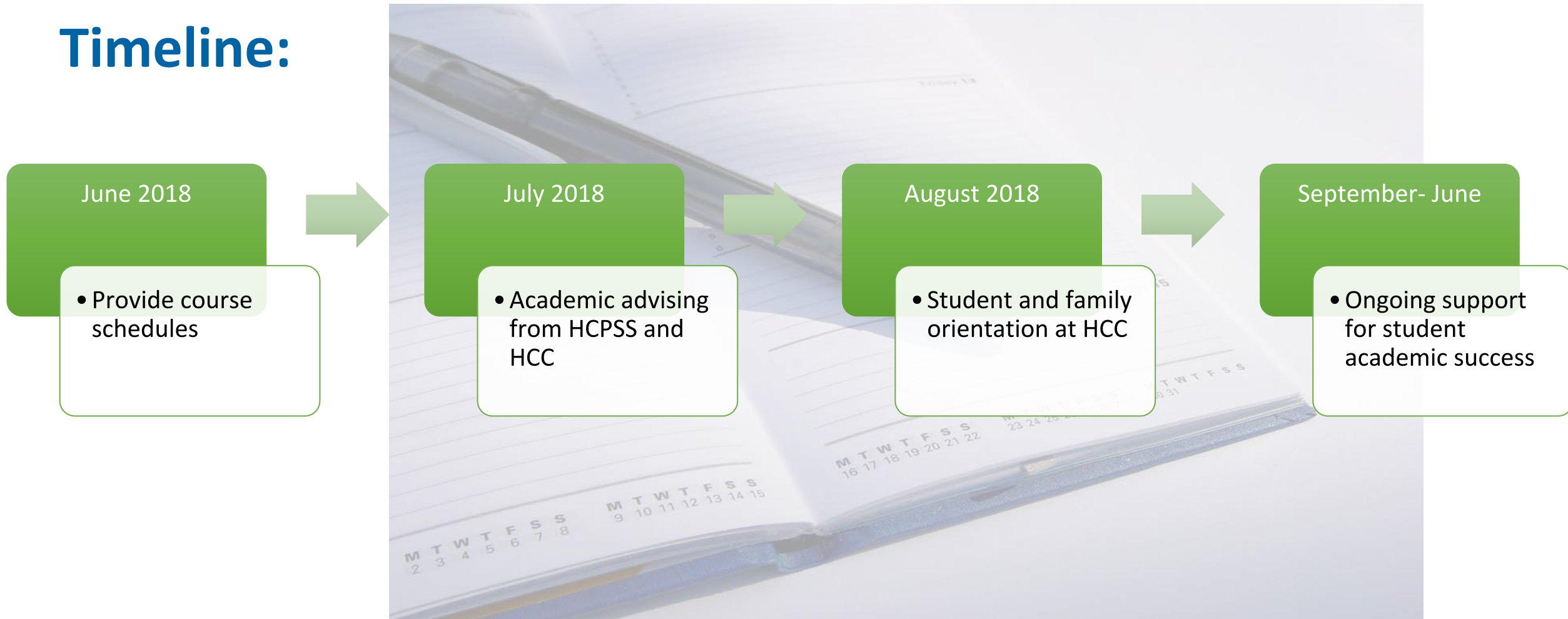
- Average term GPA for all HCPSS dually enrolled in HCC's Winter/Spring Term: 3.16
- Average cumulative GPA for HCPSS '18 Early College Cybersecurity students: 3.32
- Average cumulative GPA for HCPSS '18 Early College STEM students: 2.92
- As a point of comparison HCC Spring 2018 mean GPA: 2.5

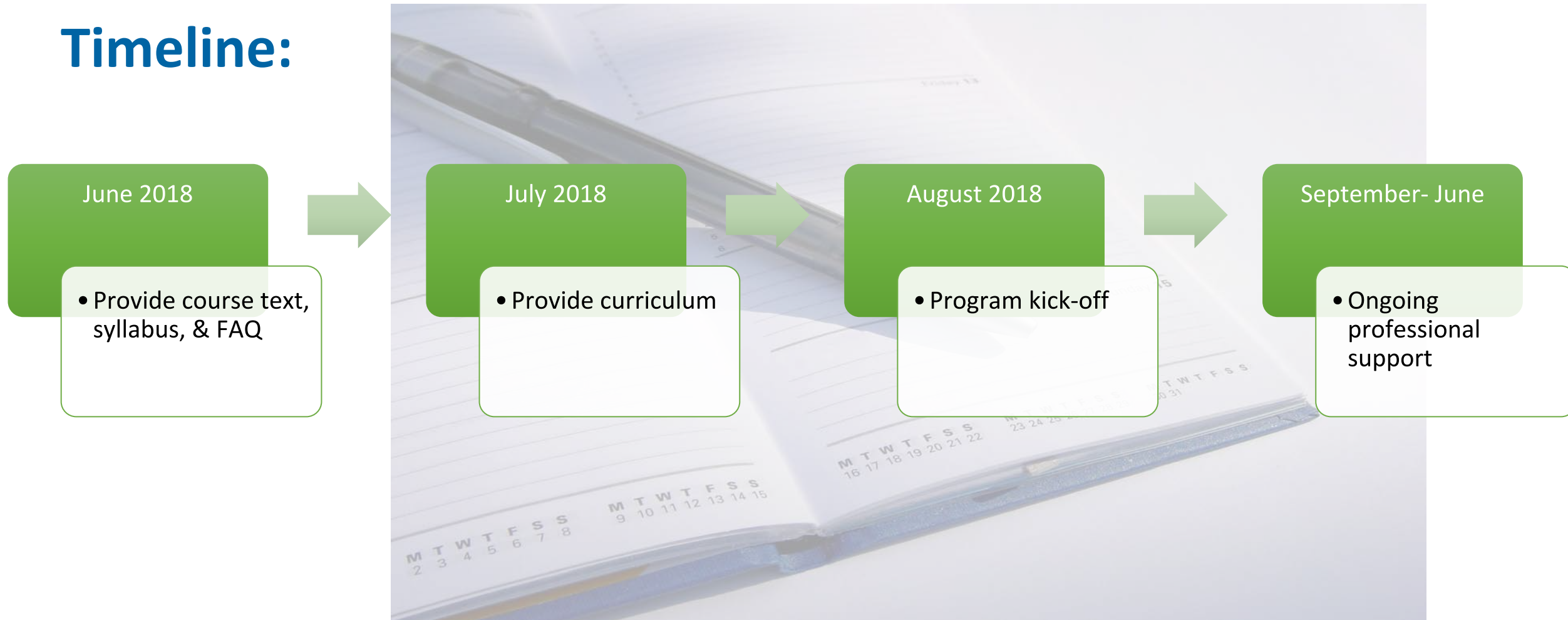
