Good evening, Mr. Barnes and the BOE (hoping Mr. Barnes is on the BOE group email address)

My name is Michelle Horner, DO. I am the PTSA president at Howard High School.

Parents are reaching out to me (and other PTSA members) by volume and we have a request.

First, I greatly appreciate that everyone is trying to do their best and this is awful. But this situation calls for a bit more than what has been offered to the community thus far and we are asking you to please, get the support you need to better <u>hear</u> and address our community concerns. See below for details.

Bottom line up front:

Request: The HoHS parent community is requesting an in-person meeting with HCPSS leadership, including the safety team, the police department, BOE members, county stakeholders who can attend.

What: A listening session that starts off with an honest discussion about how this student was allowed to be at Howard given his previous charge(s). There is fear of how much more of this is at the school, given the policies and of course the police and news reports.

Time: soon (i.e., in the next few days, at least schedule it).

Who: Planned by HoHS/HCPSS and invite the community. As a PTSA, we considered having a meeting ourselves but it's clear the community at large wants to hear from you. People from other schools are also asking for discussion.

Location: HoHS auditorium or cafeteria or another community location that makes sense for the HoHS community. Please offer zoom to allow for more representation. Let us know if we can be supportive.

I am happy to provide more details regarding the dismay and disbelief being

conveyed to me so you can anticipate the questions. But in short, parents are feeling like there is an uncomfortable attempt at redirection (e.g., odd focus on what parents/kids are supposed to do and think and feel, counselors, FAQs, reflection) instead the issue at hand: there are circumstance that allowed this all to occur, and the active, real fear of parents remain regarding another accomplice and the police statements/WBAL reports of the reason the student had an ankle bracelet. The sentiment is overwhelming and I hear it over and over again.

I want to be transparent that I'm a child psychiatrist and I've worked in juvenile detention and in the Baltimore City schools as a child psychiatrist. No one is saying that juve students don't deserve an education but no one can understand how this student was in a school that wasn't designed to offer safety or support for students with that kind of history.

Again, I am happy to give more detail if you are interested. In the meanwhile, please schedule a community meeting. Unfortunately, the absence of this discussion is fueling speculation, and increasing frustration and fear.
